

LaVerne Meyer Dies In Peotone; Services Thursday

PEOTONE (JNS) — LaVerne (Sonny) Meyer, 45, former owner of an automobile agency here, died Sunday morning in his home following a heart attack.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Lester Meyer, he was born June 27, 1917 in Peotone and was a lifelong resident of this community. He was a member of the American Legion post and of the Peotone-Will County Sportsman's Club and was formerly a member of the local Chamber of Commerce. Since the sale of his business here about 1½ years ago, he has worked as parts manager in the firm's garage.

Surviving are his widow, the former Carol Ely; sons, David and Allan, and daughters, Ardythe and Julie, all at home, and his mother, Mrs. Clara Meyer, St. Petersburg, Fla. His father preceded him in death.

Services will be Thursday at 2 p.m. in Fedde-Helfrich Funeral Home. The place of interment has not yet been determined.
