#### TRAILS OF THE WEST 1852

Reprinted from The Wilmington Advocate, Wilmington, Illinois, by Elma O. Barnes

- 1. Butterfield Overland Mail Trail. Saint Louis to Los Angeles to San Francisco.
- Branching off Butterfield Trail to Santa Fe, Los Angeles to Salt Lake City.
- 3. Santa Fe Trail. Independence, Missouri to Santa Fe. Santa Fe joins Butterfield Trail.
- 4. Oregon Trail. Independence, Missouri to Scotts Bluff on to Portland, Oregon.
- 5. California Trail. A branch of Oregon Trail. Salt Lake City to Sacramento, California. Lewis and Clark started from Independence, Missouri from Route North of the above to Portland, Oregon.

#### NEWSPAPER MICROFILMS

The Kankakee Community College has on file microfilms of all the old Kankakee newspapers that could be found beginning in July, 1854. Some dates are missing and some are hard to read. However, one thing is quite outstanding about these early papers. They are very interesting. Many facts come to light that can provide ideas and clues to the researcher that may not have been thought of previously.

Going through the microfilms of the old newspapers give the reader a "feeling" for that particular time period as the newspapers carried considerable news on Indian uprisings, political doings, slavery issues, progress of the railroads, timetables and routes of stage coaches, steamer and passenger ship arrivals on both the East Coast and in New Orleans. There were items of news from the West Coast, China and of all the "wars" around the world. Reports were given of persons who were going back to Europe, to the East and Africa as missionaries, and of those going to Russia, under commissions.

As most persons who are researching this County know, Kankakee County came into being in July, 1853. That part south of the Kankakee River being taken from Iroquois County and that part north of the river being taken from Will County.

The following article was taken from the September 23, 1854, issue of the Kankakee Gazette.

"Monday, Sept. 11, 1854. Annual Meeting. (Editor's note: This is the first meeting of the new Board of Kankakee County that I have been able to find.) Present, Suprs. Hamilton, Richards, Byrns, Sequin, and Jas. M. Perry, Clerk. Board organized, F. Sequin, in the chair.

"On motion, the Board proceeded to value the swamp and overflowed lands of Kankakee County, when on motion of Sup. Richards, it was voted that the lands be valued at a minimum price of one dollar and twenty-five cents per acre.

"When on motion, the Board adjourned till tomorrow morning at 8 o'clock, A. M.

"Tuesday, Sept. 12, 1854, Board met pursuant to adjournment. Full Board present. On motion the Board proceeded to assess lands listed by the Clerk.

"Supr. Richards then offered the following, which was adopted.

"Whereas, it is understood that Kankakee county is entitled to a further selection of swamp and overflowed lands; therefore, it is ordered that the county surveyor proceed as soon as practicable to locate all such lands as said county is entitled to. And it is further ordered that the Clerk issue county orders to such persons as may assist said surveyor in the prosecution of said work, upon the presentation of a certificate from said Surveyor, of labor performed and the amount due.

"On motion, the Board adjourned till tomorrow at 7 o'clock, A.M.

""Wednesday, Sept. 13, 1854, Board met pursuant to adjournment; all the members present.

"J. Gutterson filed his bill for transcribing the records from Will and Iroquois counties. Matter taken up, and on motion, the bill allowed in the amount of \$1,430.83.

"Ordered, by vote of the Board that J. Gutterson be authorized to procure suitable desks for the preservation of records and papers of the Clerks' offices.

"The following bills were presented and allowed: Sheriff Byrns presented \$8.85, allowed \$8.03; J. M. Perry \$3.65, allowed the same; Nathaniel Mellen \$39.76, allowed the same.

"PAUPER BILLS. M. Richards \$8 allowed; J. E. Armoit, \$10 allowed; do. \$10, allowed \$5 do. \$8.50, allowed; H. A. Vallorand, \$19.81, allowed.

"Wm. Stag, for record and Books, \$97.83, allowed \$88.70. Bill of Diamon & Secor, presented and rejected. Bill withdrawn.

"The following pauper bills were presented and laid over for future action. Bill of J. J. Cookingham, for \$5, J. E. Armoit, \$6, Benoin Safleur, \$6.14, C. B. & A. T. Ingham, \$61.50, Dr. Ward \$110.77.

On motion, Voted, that the Clark order twenty-five copies of township organization forms from Messrs. Raney & Hildreth, of Peoria, Ill. and that he draw an order on the treasury for the same.

Ordered, That the county Clerk be authorized to arrange in suitable form for overseers of road districts, warrants from the commissioners of highways, with forms and instructions, and so much of the statute as is necessary to enable the overseers to make their returns correctly to the supervisor, and cause two

hundred of said forms to be printed, and that the Clerk draw an order on the treasury for paying for said printing.

"Petition of T. B. Bonfield and others for a new town in Kankakee bounty, presented, presented, and on motion of Supr. Richards, it was unanimously voted to lay said petition on the table.

"On motion, the Board proceeded to drew jurors for the next November term of Circuit Court, when the following named persons \_\_\_\_\_: (unable to read the last two words)

"On motion, the Board adjourned till 7 o'clock tomorrow morning.

"Thursday, Sept. 14, 1854. Board met pursuant to adjournment; all present. The following bills were presented and allowed:

"Bill of George Laturno & Co. \$6.90; Medad Martin, \$37.85, allowed; Antoine Martin, \$26.40, allowed; J. & G. F. Smith, \$3, allowed; A. Darche, \$4, allowed \$2.

"On motion, the following order passed:

"Ordered, That there be levied and collected for the year A. D. 1854, in the several towns in this county, the sum of Fifty Cents on each hundred dollars of taxable property as assessed by the several town assessors, for said year, in said county, and that the sum be collected by the. several town collectors and treasurer of said county, in gold and silver coin, and county and jury orders issued by the authority of said county, and in no other currency; and that there also be levied and collected as aforesaid the amount of unpaid road tax, as assessed by highway commissioners of said county on lands and town lots as returned on the list of overseers of road districts to the supervisors of the several towns and on file in the Clerk's office, and that the same be collected in gold and silver coin; also, that there be levied and collected against the several towns in said county for defraying town charges as follows: Yellowhead, seven cents; Bourbonnais, six cents; Rockville, six cents; Limestone, six cents, as assessed as aforesaid; also, that there be levied and collected the sum of one hundred and fifty five dollars against the town of Rockville, and five hundred dollars against the town of Bourbonnais, as special road and bridge taxes, as per vote of said towns; and also, that there be levied and collected a State tax, and School tax as is authorized by law, and that the county Clerk be and is hereby authorized to enter the same on the several tax books for said year 1854.

"On motion of Supr. Hamilton, A, Hawkins was appointed an agent on the part of the county to borrow of the Bank of Danville, Ill, or elsewhere, a sum not exceeding four thousand dollars, upon the best terms that can be obtained.

"On motion of Supr. Richards, James Byrns was duly constituted an agent of the county to loan of the Dupage County Bank four thousand dollars in the event that Mr. Hawkins does not obtain said amount.

On motion of Supr. Byrns, G. Gay, A. Hawkins and J, B. Hamilton were added to the Court House building committee.

"On motion, the Board fixed the following sums to be allowed supervisors for county services: Jacob B. Hamilton, \$16.50; Wm. C. Richards, \$15.00; James Byrns, \$15.00; Francis Seguin \$15.00; George Gay, \$13.50; Alanson Hawkins, \$13.50; Total, \$88.50.

On motion of Supr. Hamilton, the proceedings of the Board, since the last publication, were ordered to be published in the Kankakee Gazette: On motion, the Board adjourned to the first Monday of October next.

Also, in the October 14, 1854 issue of the Gazette: "Died in this city, at the residence of his son, J. W. PADDOCK, Esq., on the 13th inst. James PADDOCK, Esq., after a long and painful illness. Aged nearly 77 years. Funeral tomorrow (sabbath) at 10 o'clock AM at the residence of his son."

A special term of the Kankakee County Circuit Court was to be held in Bourbonnais on 13 November 1854 with the Hon. Hugh Henderson, Judge, presiding. Notices were given of the following cases to be heard. Notices were served by George W. Byrnes, Sheriff of said County.

- Filed Sept. 7, 1854 A suit was brought against Richard HALL for \$120.00 by Albert G. HOBBIE

Notice was given on August 22, 1854 for the upcoming election of November, 1854, two candidates for Office of Sheriff of Kankakee County who are: Augustus T. INGHAM and C. M. VAUGHN.

Other interesting items from the Kankakee Gazettes of 1854:

Sept. 16, 1854 - an ad appeared with the dating of June 27, 1854 placed by James GAY, School Commissioner of Kankakee City, advising persons interested in getting certificates to teach school, may call upon him for examination or to the following associates: Nelson BRIANT, Momence; Dr. MERRICK, Rockville; A. W. WARNER, Limestone; or A. CHESTER, Editor of the paper.

A. CHESTER carried many ads in the Kankakee Gazette and listed his title as "Attorney at Law and Land Agent. One of his ads appeared in the July 22, 1854 issue as: "A. CHESTER, Kankakee City or M. MARTIN offers for sale 70 acres near Bourbonnais Grove P. O. of which 50 (are) in Prairie and 20 (are in) timber with good house and barn and a shop 60 feet in length."

August 4., 1854, entitled "First Issue in Kansas" - "The first trial affecting squatter claims came up in Kansas on the 23rd of June (1854.). The Parties were Dr. SAUNDERRS v. John LEWIS. The case was tried before Dr. BARNES, Judge FREELAND and J. S. FITCH, of the vigilent committees. D. A. GROVES and P. T. ABELL appeared for Plaintiff; James N. BURNES for Defendant. The points raised in the case were whether a claim made prior to the passage of the Nebraska-Kansas bill was a valid claim or not. The Court ruled it was not. Second, whether a claim was transferable or not. The Court decided it was not. Judgment was given in favor of LEWIS, the Defendant. Appeal was taken to a full bench of the vigilant committee."

Sept. 2, 1854 - "The Placerville Mountain Democrat (California) announces the death of F. A. SNYDER, Esq. He was formerly a citizen of Monroe County, Illinois, graduated at McKendree College at an early age, was admitted to the Practice of Law at 19, was appointed Lieutenant in the 16th Regement of the Gragoons, under Col. Tibbutts, and after the war, went to California, where he was much respected."

Sept. 23, 1854 - an article entitled "Deaths from sun stroke" "During the past week two deaths have occurred in this city from sun stroke. The first victim was Mrs. MURPHY, wife of Thomas MURPHY. On Thursday she started to visit her daughter-in-law, but before she reached the house fell and was soon a corpse, amidst the lamentations of stricken relatives and friends. The other, was German, a vigorous healthy man who was struck down as grass before the mower scythe. People should be cautious about exposing themselves to the scorching rays of the sun."

Sept. 16,11854 states "A Congregational Church has been recently organized at Kankakee City and measures are to be taken for the erection of a house of worship. The Rev. Mr. TURNER, recently of Iowa, is now in this place and is expected to remain here."

On October 7, 1854, D. T. VANMETER placed the following ad: "All per sons hereby are notified that the grounds near my house, used for a burial place, are private grounds, and not adapted to a public cemetery; and persons are requested to select some other place for burying their dead. Those interested in the improvement of these can bury as heretofore." (Editor's note: Does anyone know what Mr. Vanmeter meant by this ad?)
