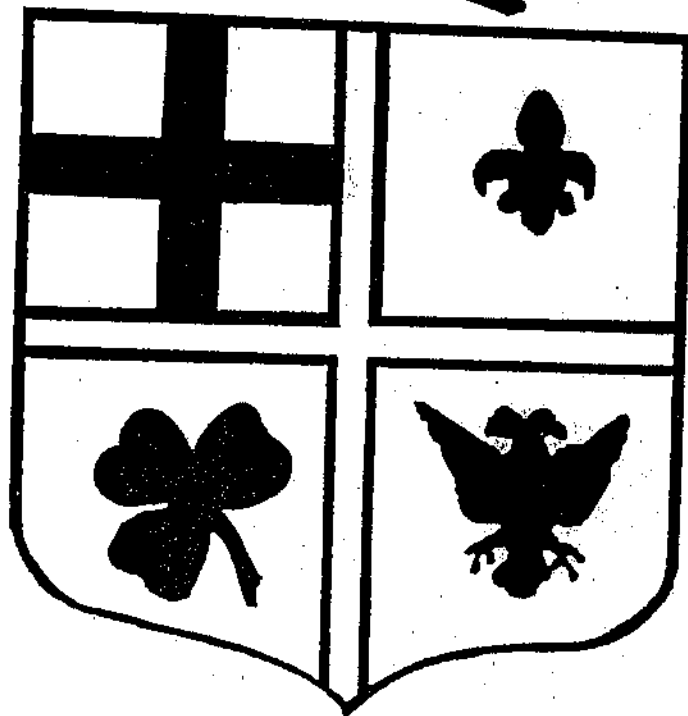

MOMENCE, ILLINOIS - 1834-1984

The town of Momence in eastern Kankakee County is celebrating its 150th birthday this summer. Beginning June 10th and continuing through Labor Day weekend, Momence is planning a jam-packed summer of celebrations. The emphasis will be on family-style celebrations.

Momence, located on the beautiful Kankakee River, began life as the only settlement between Fort Dearborn (now Chicago) and Danville to the south. This small city which almost became our county seat still retains its antique flavor. It remains a "Victorian" type town with many of its lovely old homes and its emphasis on the river.

Some of the activities planned are a revival of the old-time band concerts in the park, house walks open houses and a recreation of the first July 4th celebration of 1840.

Offered for sale will be several items imprinted with historical scenes and a cookbook "Recipes from the Old Border Town, 1834-1984," a collection of favorite foods from Momence citizens. Reprinted is the Bert Burroughs book "Tales of An Old Border Town." There will be approximately 100 copies available during the celebration for the pickup price of \$12.95

FRIEND FAMILY ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA

...will hold its 7th Biennial workshop/genealogical seminar and national meeting headquartered at Grantsville, MD Holiday Inn on August 10-12, 1984.

The Association is a unique, not-for-profit genealogical group organized for the purpose of providing a strong organization of kindred folk through which members and descendants of the various lines may establish and perpetuate the deeds and accomplishments of their ancestors.

Current membership is in excess of 400 and their projected goal is "500 in '84". The 500th members is to be especially recognized as a part of the '84 seminar program.

The Friend family is particularly interesting because of its long period in the U.S. Friendsville, MD was founded in 1765 by John Friend, Sr. who emigrated from Hampshire Co., W. VA and settled on the west bank of the Youghiogheny River with his wife Karrenhap-puch Hyatt and their children.

A National Headquarters is maintained which includes the facilities of the Col. Lester D. Friend, Sr. Historical Library. This unusually large and diversified data bank serves as a premier research center for those seeking to establish, preserve and extend their gen. lines of descent. A large portion of this library will be housed in a special room at the Grantsville, MD. Holiday Inn and will be available for individual research. There will also be a large variety of Friend handcrafted articles on display and a number of genealogical presentations are planned as well as all-day, Friend-related, guided tours of the immediate area.

Open to non-members as well as members, both genealogical beginners and serious scholars are welcome to participate. Early indications are that attendance may exceed the nearly 200 who participated in the 1980 seminar in Ft. Wayne, IN and the 1982 seminar in Huntington Beach, CA.

STATUE OF LIBERTY and ELLIS ISLAND

The National Park Service and Dept. of Interior decided several years ago to rehabilitate the Statue of Liberty by its 100th birthday. Located on Liberty Island in New York Harbor, the statue was a gift from the people of France on October 28, 1886 to the people of the U.S. to commemorate 100 years of independence.

Designed by Gustav Eiffel (before there was such a thing as stainless steel) using a copper skin over an iron framework, her metallurgical rejuvenation will take two years and will be celebrated on July 4, 1986 and again on October 28, 1986.

A targeted \$230 million for the restoration project will come from corporations, foundations and citizens throughout the U.S., a totally private sector effort. Overseeing the project is the Statue of Liberty-Ellis Island Centennial Commission, established by Pres. Reagan and headed by Lee Iococca, Chairman of Chrysler Corp.

Even though Ellis Island's centennial is not until 1992, the NPS hopes to raise funds through the effort associated with the statue.

Among projects for the 271 acres of Ellis Island are the restoration of the major buildings out of the 33 historic structures on the island. Approximately 17 million immigrants entered this country through its doors between 1892 and 1933. Their descendants make up about 40 percent of our present U. S. population.

Also planned is a genealogical library. They are in the process of compiling all the old immigration records and intend to go back to ship records and create a data base that will allow anyone to come and search out their roots.

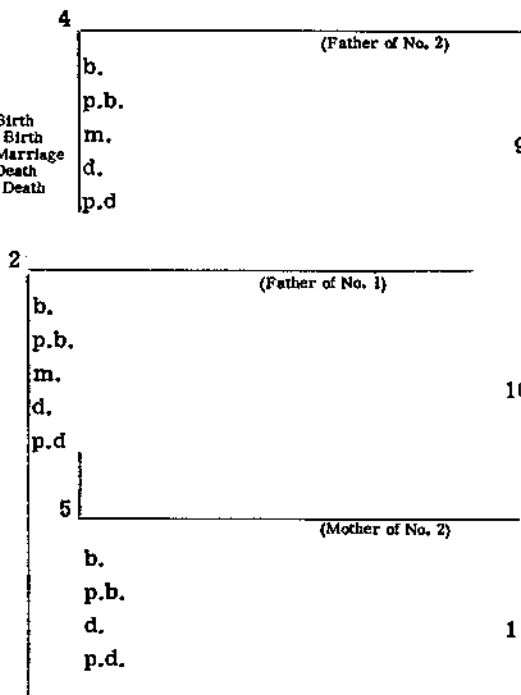

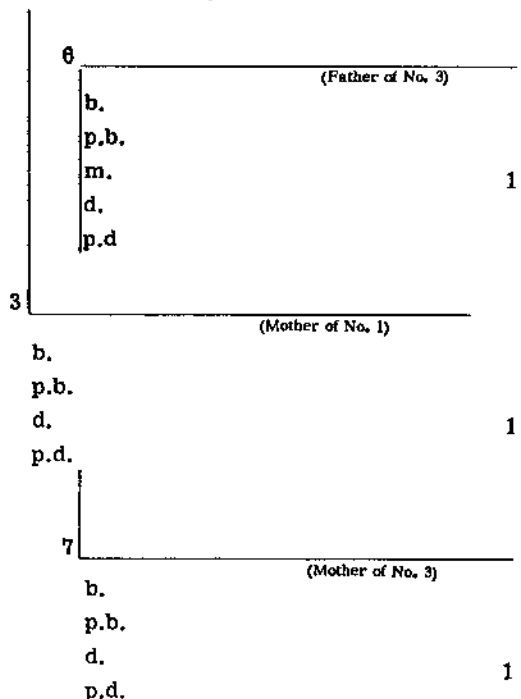
