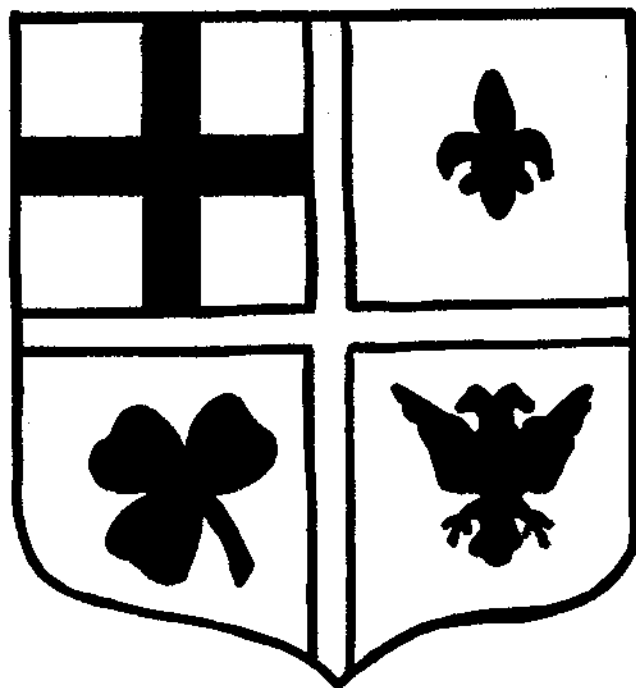

BURIAL PLACES OF SOLDIERS AND SAILORS

(Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 21, Paragraphs 59a-59d)

Paragraph 59b, CEMETERIES TO KEEP RECORDS--FURNISH INFORMATION.

2. Every person, firm or corporation owning or controlling. any cemetery or burial place in this State shall be itself, his or its superintendent or agent, keep a permanent separate record of the burial of each and every United States War Veteran, such record to contain the name of the veteran, date of death, the war, his rank and organization served in, dates of enlistment and discharge, with location of grave in cemetery and shall report such information to the Administrator of the Illinois Veterans' Commission when requested. The Administrator shall, upon applications furnish blank forms indicating the form and content of the report to be made and filed as herein provided. For filing and recording such report, The Administrator may charge a fee of 25 cents to be paid by the person, firm or corporation owning or controlling the cemetery. Any person, firm or corporation owning or controlling a cemetery or burial place, who fails to make and file such report within 30 days of receipt of such request is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$100. It is the duty of the State's attorney in the bounty where the cemetery or burial place is located to enforce the provisions of this Act. (Amended by Act approved July 6, 1953.)

WORKSHEET FOR COUNTY RESEARCH

When you are ready to begin county research (our own or another county) it will be helpful to make a "worksheet" with the following information before you start out. Much of this can be done using the telephone to the major library or libraries in the particular county.

- "Name of county" "Date organized" "County seat"
- "Parent county or counties" "Other boundary changes, with dates"
- "County historical Society" "Days and times available"
- "County genealogical Society" "Days and times available"
- "County records" "Any special comments" "Church Records"
- "Cemetery records" "County histories" "Town & Township histories"
- "Census records" "Manuscript and microfilms available"
- "Other records" "Surnames to check" "Other addresses in county"
- "Researcher" "Date of Research" "Method of research"

Also list all books, microfilm numbers, and addresses of repositories that you did search.

Standard notebook paper on a pad or in a 3-ring binder or a theme book can be used.

COMPUTERIZED GENEALOGY LIBRARY

"Are Your Ancestors In Our Computer? That is the question asked by an obscure company which offers a unique genealogical resource to its patrons. A lineage linked, computerized genealogy database of about 310,000 names, the major function of which is to help you to avoid duplicating research work someone else has already done.

"How can you check this resource for your ancestors? It's easy, you just send them \$10.00 and they will send you all entries from the index to their database for the surname you requested. If you want to look up more than eight surnames you can buy a copy of their index on microfiche for \$75.00 per set. You can then use the readers at your local library to do your own searching. If you find the ancestor you are looking for you can purchase print-Outs from their computer in several forms including pedigree charts with index, family group records, and descendant lists with addresses.

"Those who catch the vision of this far reaching project invest in its cause by having their pedigree computerized. Most patrons find that they will receive back more information than they submitted. When this is not the case, patrons still benefit because their research findings are now stored in a safe place that is easy to access. In addition to this the lineage linked database has a magic all its own on Family Trees. It makes them grow like weeds. Most new projects bring with them new data that extends lines which are already in the computer. As each line is extended someone easels pedigree grows. Not everyone will benefit from this kind of growth but most pedigrees will to some extent, some growing as much as four or five times their original size.

The Missouri Historical Society has established a special research service designed to assist historians and genealogists unable to visit the Society's Research Library and Archives.

This new program, staffed by a professional researcher in residence, will provide researchers access to more than 120,000 volumes in the library and 2,000,000 manuscripts in the archives.

The resident researcher will survey both genealogical and historical sources and will provide a written report summarizing the work completed, including, if necessary, an estimate of additional time required to complete the research.

The following fee schedule will apply: MHS members - \$10.00 per hour; non-members - \$15.00 per hour. (Three-hour minimum charge for initial investigation.) Photocopies will be billed at 25 cents per page.

NOTE: Investigation will be limited to materials in the collections of the Missouri Historical Society. Genealogists are asked to provide information on research already completed and family group sheets pertinent to the research. Several weeks must be allowed for completion of each request.
