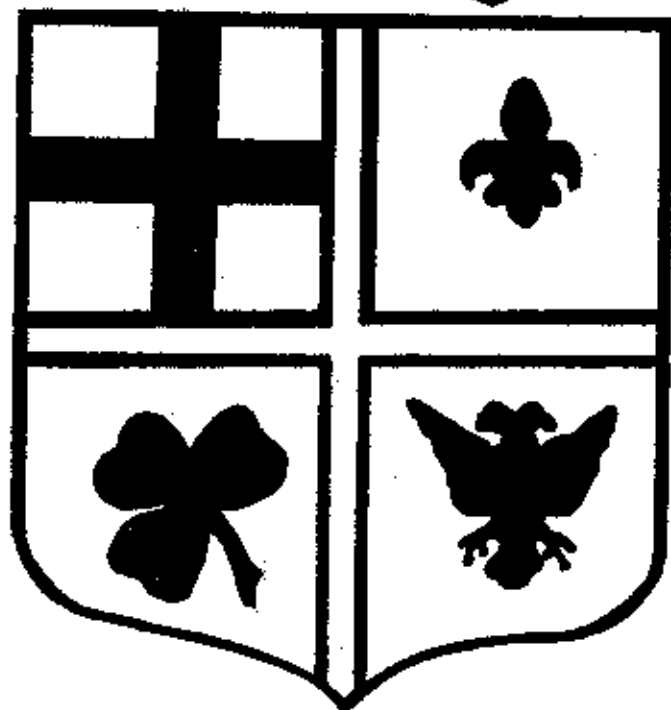

THE EAST END-1877

Taken from The Kankakee Gazette, January 11, 1877.

The Grant schoolhouse is to be newly and fashionably seated. The News says that Frank Campbell's house caught fire a short time ago and came very near being consumed.

At the Christmas dance at the National Hotel the hall was literally crammer A good many married people were there and they seemed to enjoy the dance as well, if not better than the young people. At the New Year's dance it was the same thing.

Patrick Burchard lost last fall between fifty and sixty hogs of cholera. Their weight was from 100 to 250 lbs each.

They complain bitterly of sneak thieves in Grant. If a man hitches his horse to a hitching post, or even under any of the church sheds in the village, he is liable to lose everything left in the wagon or sleigh.

A Polander, employed on Levi Haslett's farm, was badly wounded the other day by the accidental discharge of a gun. The load took effect in his side and face.

The Eugene ice company have filled their house in Momence. It took a little over 2,600 cakes of ice to make one layer, and three layers was considered good day's work. The ice is cut 22 inches square. The ice house is 33 fey high and is filled to the height of 30 feet. The cost of filling the house is about \$3,000 and the cost of emptying it will be near \$5,00. The house holds 7,000 tons.

BOARD OF EDUCATION - 1876

Taken from The Kankakee Gazette. June 29. 1876

Adjourned meeting of the Board of Education, Tuesday, June 20, 1876

The following members answered to their names: President J. C. Matter, Dr. Taylor, S. B. Burchard, A. Ames, Adam Zinkann, R. Lavery.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved. To the members of the Board of Education, Kankakee, Ill.:

Please find enclosed report of examining committee conducted by your committee on June 10th, 1876. J. H. Barnard, Ch'n.

On motion of S. B. Burchard the report of the examining committee was received.

On motion of S. B. Buchard, the following teachers, Miss Price, Miss Shitcomb and Miss Enos, were granted leave of absence without compensation.

Mrs. Rose's petition to the board stating that she had been sick at the time of examination and asked to be excused. On motion the prayer was granted.

A number of bills were read and allowed.

On motion of S. B. Burchard, the office of first assistant teacher in the high school was declared vacant.

On motion of A. Ames, A. E. Rowell was appointed superintendent of the high school.

On motion of Dr. Taylor, the following teachers were appointed: Miss L. Leavett 2d assistant teacher, Miss K. Breakes, Miss F. Mateer, Miss E. L. Perry, Miss Mary McCabe, Miss L. Carmichael, Mrs. Rose.

On motion of S. B. Burchard, Miss V. Leavitt was appointed teacher.

On motion of R. Lavery, Miss S. Small was appointed teacher.

On motion of S. B. Burchard, the pay of teachers and janitors for the month of June was allowed, and the clerk directed to draw orders for the same.

On motion of Dr. Taylor the sum of five dollars was allowed to each of the members of the board of examiners and the clerk directed to draw orders for the same.

No further business, on motion of S. B. Burchard the board adjourned until third Tuesday in July, 1876. Richard Lavery, Clerk Bd. Ed'n.

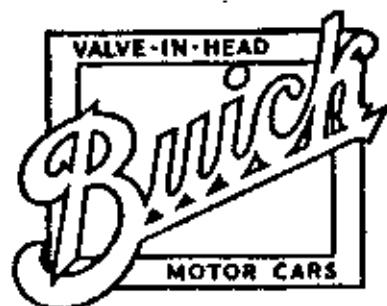

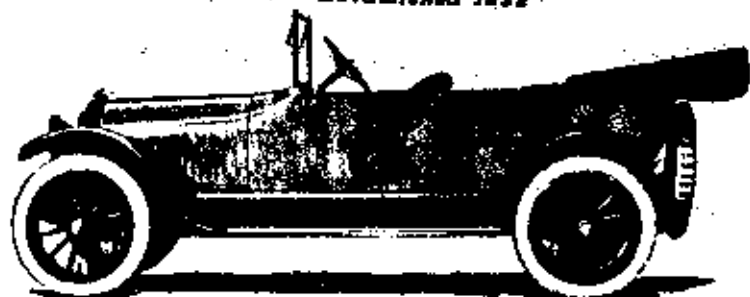

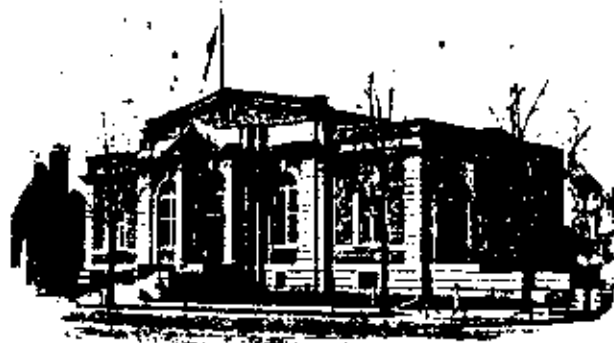
