Inward/Outward Slave Manifests

The Allen County Library, Ft. Wayne, Indiana, has slave manifests on microfilm for the Port of New Orleans. There are 12 rolls dating from 1807 through 1860 of inward manifests and 12 rolls dating from 1812 through 1860 of outward manifests. The manifest documentation provides the following kinds of ownership that could have existed for any one of the slaves being shipped to New Orleans:

- 1. Owner is a planter moving via sea his whole plantation (slave, equipment, etc.) to the Port of New Orleans. Occasionally the place of relocation is provided.
- 2. Owner is a slave trader who has bona fide papers showing that he is the owner and that he is consigning a lot of slaves to either his agent or his slave trading house in New Orleans.
- 3. An agent or consignee is shipping slaves to be sold in the New Orleans market individually or as a group.

The list provides the owner/shipper name, consignee and agent, ship name, embarkation port and port of arrival. If the slave's speech, mannerism, or description was suspect, they could be held back upon arrival for investigation and the manifest so noted. The manifest contains the name, age, description of the slave and sometimes a female slave will have her children's names listed with her entry. Currently they do not have a complete index for this collection, but the records are well organized by ports and dates.

1882 KANKAKEE COUNTY DEATHS

(14 Dec 1882) In Momence, Dec. 4, erysipelas in the face, complicating a six weeks' run of typhoid. Mrs. Hannah Richardson, aged 50 years.

(14 Dec 1882) In Limestone, at the residence of his brother, John M. Stokes, Dec. 7, 1882, of typhoid fever, Joel Martin Stokes, fifth son of George and Mary D. Stokes, aged 32 years, 5 months and 3 days.

(21 Dec 1882) Near Redfield, D.T., Nov. 9, of diphtheria, George L., aged 6 years and 7 months; and Nov. 10. Emeline, aged 3 years and 2 months, only children of Leander and Emeline Exline, formerly of Kankakee county.

(28 Dec 1882) In St. Anne, Nov. 18, of heart disease Eliza Catherine Hughes, aged 16 years, 7 months.

(28 Dec 1882) Mrs. Cynthia B. Storrs, the third daughter of Dea. S. B. Burchard, of Hamilton, NY, departed this life on Wednesday morning, the 18th instant. She was born at Marshall, Oneida county, NY. At the age of three years, the family moved to Madison county, where at the age of eleven, she was converted under the religious teachings of Mrs. Dr. Vinton, afterward a Baptist missionary to the Karens in India. In 1840 she was united in marriage of William B. Storrs. and in 1867 the family moved to this city. From the time of her conversion to her decease her life was that of a faithful, intelligent, consistent christian. Her last days on earth were spent in the beautiful home of her daughter, Mrs. H. K. Wheeler, of this city, surrounded by every comfort and attention of kindred and friends that love or duty could possibly prompt. Throughout a long and painful illness she was patient and gentle, and the habitual sweetness of her disposition was marked by all who met her. To her daughter and grand children, as well as relatives and friends, she bequeaths the rich legacy of a life and example fragrant with christian sympathy and love. She was a member of the First Baptist church in this city.

Hawker chaplain, L. Miller steward, J. Koon assistant, Mrs. J. Koon lady assistant, J. E. Shreffler secretary, Elias Powell treasurer, and Messrs. Shreffler, Powell and R. H. Hawker trustees. At a subsequent meeting it was decided to second the action of the young people in getting up an entertainment at the hall on Monday evening, Dec. 25, at which place and time a Christmas tree will be provided and loaded with presents for the children in attendance. There will be tableaux, charades, reading and a variety of amusing and literary exercises, interspersed with music by the Shreffler family, including six year old Joey beating time upon his drum. We think the entertainment will be both pleasing and instructive, and from the character and ability of the six ladies and gentlemen having charge of it, have no doubt of its success.

Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Richardson, of this city, have a great affliction to bear in the death of their little Maud, three years old. She was ill a week with malarial fever.

Townsend, the jeweler, recently made a sale of the finest clock in town to Zilke for the latter's saloon. It is eight feet high, enclosed in an elegant walnut case, and cost \$125.

Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Lanham, who reside on Schuyler Avenue, near the river, recently lost their remaining child, a boy of three years, after a two days' illness with diphtheria. They have had seven sons born to them in succession and all have died at an early age.

Walter W. Hatch, of this city, now engaged in superintending the construction of telegraph lines in the Northwest, was seriously injured last week at some point in Iowa not reported. He was riding on an engine which ran off the track, burying him in the wreck. His arm is broken and he has suffered other injuries, the nature and extent of which his relatives here will learn by letter from his wife who went to him. Walter is very much respected in Kankakee and his speedy recovery will be anxiously looked for.

MANTENO - 1882

fully recovered from a short but very serious illness.

Dr. Ellingwood has secured the valuable services of Mr. Arnold, who is an experienced druggist, to take charge of his drug store during the winter and early spring. Mr. Bailey will remove in a few weeks to New Hampshire from whence he came five years ago. We are sorry to lose so good a citizen.

Joe Grant, lately with V. L. Morey, will start in the grocery business in his store room south of the post office. Joe is a worthy young man of good business principles and will undoubtedly make a success of the enterprise.

ESSEX - 1882

Taken from the Kankakee Gazette, December 14, 1882.

Work is going on in full blast at the Mix shaft. D. Kemp is the foreman and is pushing the work forward with great vigor. Tracey is the name of our new town at the Kewen shaft. We understand that one of the buildings which are now being erected will be used for a saloon.

Susan Krieble has just returned from a long visit with her brother in Nebraska in company with several other relatives. H.T. McLane will stop with his mother in Essex for a few weeks.

It was rumored about that one of Mrs. A. Brunner's limbs was broken in taking her from the bed to a chair. This is not true. It was done simply by turning her over in bed. Her death was caused by an ulcer and not by a cancer as stated last week. I make this correction at the request of a very near relative. Mrs. B. was confined to her bed nearly eighteen months, during which time she suffered terribly but patiently. Her limb was so nearly eaten off by the ulcer that it took but very little to break it; hence the accident in turning her over.

Mrs. Craddock, of Kankakee, was in town today looking up her interest in the millinery business. Mr. Daniel Messinger, brother-in-law of R. H. Charter, is here from Pennsylvania visiting his friends and relatives.

Byron Underwood is building an addition to his house. John White has opened a barber shop in the Wabash house.

Corn is worth 40 cents per bushel; oats, 30 cents; potatoes, 70 to 90 cents; eggs, 27 cents per dozen; butter, 30 cents per pound.

S. S. Kimball has just returned from Dakota. He gives some very glowing accounts of that country. The Squire is looking well and we are glad to see him in our midst again.

The foreman of the Mix shaft informs me that after this week they expect to take out fifty tons per day. There is now room for forty-four miners at shaft No. 7 in Tracy. native of the celebrated Mohawk Valley, New York, and was of Dutch descent. She died in Kankakee county in 1901, aged eighty-five years. They were the parents of seven children, all of whom are living except one son, Morris, who was killed in defense of his country during the Civil war. The others are: Owen L., Lucy, Friend E., Worth W., Emma and Rush C.

W. W. Bird was the fifth child in the family of his parents, and was but about eighteen months old when brought to what is now Kankakee county. He was reared upon the farm, drawing his early education from the common schools of the period. When he was about six years old he had the misfortune to lose his father, and at an early age he was compelled to take up life's burdens, working on the farm as soon as able. He remained at home with his mother until 1872, when he married Miss Addie Hilborn, the daughter of John Hilborn, of Wilmington, Illinois. He then took up farming on his own account and was quite successful. About 1875 he gave up agricultural pursuits and devoted his energies to opening up and running the stone quarry now known as the Kerr West Side quarry, which he still owns. This he carried on until about 1892, when he leased the quarry and retired from active business. His wife died in July, 1893, and Mr. Bird married Miss Ida Darche, a native of this county, daughter of William and Caroline (Marcotte) Darche, in 1904.

Mr. Bird has been a resident of Kankakee county for fifty-four years, and has been prominently identified with the development of this section of the state. He has always been enterprising and public spirited and willing to lend a helping hand to any good cause.

In politics Mr. Bird is a strong republican and has represented the Second ward in the city council. He held the office of highway commissioner for eighteen years and takes an active part in public affairs. He was for two years president of the Commercial Club of Kankakee, is vice-president of the North Kankakee Electric Light & Street Railway Company and a stockholder 'in the Eastern Illinois Trust and Savings Bank. He has been a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows since 1872. Socially, he has many friends and is well and favorably known throughout the county. By unfailing energy in earlier daysand by thrift and foresight he has acquired a

sufficiency of this world's goods and now enjoys the ease and content he so well deserves.

BIRR, BERNHARD J .- Contractor and builder, 160 Washington avenue, Kankakee; was born in Germany, January 4th, 1868. He is the son of Henry and Mina (Kurrasch) Birr, both natives also of the Fatherland. The family crossed the wide Atlantic in search of a new home in May, 1870, and settled in Kankakee. His rather was a laborer and in the humbler walks of life was quite a prominent factor in the development of the young city. He took an active part in the organization of the St. John's Evangelical Lutheran church, and died in 1875. His widow, who makes her home with the subject of this brief memoir. still survives him. She was born in 1834. She had a family of eight children, seven of whom are living and all in Kankakee. They are: Otto, a mail carrier; Ida, Mrs. Herman Ganse; Mary, Mrs. H. Handorf; Bertha, Mrs. Albert Schneider; Frank H., a merchant tailor; Bernhard J., of whom these memoirs are written; and Martha, a milliner. The eighth is deceased.

Mr. Birr was educated at St. John's German Evangelical school, but his English education was entirely self acquired, although he studied some under the tutorage of Prof. Stammer, now of Chicago. As he grew up he worked some four years in the woolen mill. The succeeding years he was employed in Teed's shoe factory, and then spent four years and six months with the Illinois Central railroad in Kankakee county, this state, and at Sacramento bridge yard. In February, 1892, he began house carpentering, and after some four years commenced his present business as contractor and builder. He has done business to the extent of a hundred thousand dollars in the last six years and his work is of an excellent character. He is a good careful workman, understands his business and gives everything personal supervision.

Mr. Birr was united in marriage November 22, 1900, with Miss Annie Zielke, a native of Kankakee, and daughter of William and Pauline (Marshke) Zielke. Both her parents were born in Germany, there grew to maturity and

married. They came to the United States in 1872. The father is still living, but the mother died June 1st, 1894. Mr. and Mrs. Birr are the parents of three children: William and Heinrich, twins; and Arthur F. William died when but five days old.

Mr. and Mrs. Birr are devout and consistent members of the St. John's Evangelical church and take active interest in all religious work. Politically Mr. Birr is an ardent republican, and is an active worker in the cause of promoting its success. Socially, he is a member of the Yoeman of America. He is regarded in the community as a model citizen, straightforward and upright in all his dealings, honorable in his duties to others, and he is highly esteemed. As a workman he has the confidence of the public, and has acquired a most excellent standing in Kankakee and the county.

In the family of Mrs. Birr, there were six brothers and sisters, of which the following is the record: Robert, formerly with the telephone company at Vicksburg; Minnie, who died in childhood, in Germany; Annie, Mrs. Birr; William, who died December 23, 1904, at the age of twenty-nine years, leaving a widow, who was born Miss Eva Rennich; John, and Fred and Hattie, twins.

BISSONNETTE, ZEPHIERE. — Among the native sons who are maintaining the pioneer records of their fathers, and establishing a precedent for others with their greater energy and greater wealth of opportunity, mention is due Zephiere Bissonnette, whose entire life has been passed within the borders of the farm he now owns and lives upon. Born January 9, 1876, his parents were Peter and Mathilda (Granger) Bissonnette, who were natives of Canada, and very early settlers of Kankakee county. The father, after accumulating a competence, laid aside his implements and enjoyed a few years of leisure, his death occurring on his farm in Ganeer township, November 1, 1898. The mother, with the snows of many winters in her hair, but with faculties alert, makes her home in the town of Manteno. She was one of the brave pioneer women of the state, not only keeping her husband's house in order and supervising some of the outdoor tasks, but caring for a family of fourteen children, eight of whom now are living: Fred, Arthur, Celia, Diana, Henry, Olivius, Zephiere, and Doiphus.

Like his numerous brothers and sisters, Zephiere Bissonnette worked hard in his youth, and attended school only when the home tasks lightened in the winter time. Eventually he took a course at the St. George private school, and his life passed uneventfully until his marriage, February 14, 1899, to Lizzie Lereger, a native of Kankakee county, and daughter of Emory and Josephine Lereger, pioneers of Illinois. Three children have been born into the Bissonnette family: Edmund, Pearl and Harry. The family are members of the Catholic church of St. George. Mr. Bissonnette is a republican in politics, but prefers the peace of his home with its steady occupations, to the stress and uncertainty of office seeking. He is a liberal minded, wide awake young man, anxious to succeed better than his fellows, and understanding well the qualities of character and work which win worth while rewards. He is personally popular, and financially prosperous, representing the progressive and promising element in the county.

BLACKSTONE, JOHN S., farmer living On section 18, Bourbonnais township, has a fine home farm of two hundred and forty acres, all well improved and under a high state of tilth, besides another farm of fifty-five acres, and thirty-three acres of timber land. He is one of the pioneers of this region, and merits the respect and esteem of the entire community. Beginning at the bottom of the ladder, he has, by hard work and thrift placed himself above circumstances, and enjoys, in his declining years, the results of his earlier toil.

Mr. Blackstone was born in Brooklyn, N. Y., January 12, 1832. He was brought west by his parents, who, settling in Chicago, died and' left him a helpless infant of a year old. John Blackstone, Senior, and his good wife Jane (Glover) Blackstone, adopted the little orphan and, with two other adopted children, raised him. Mr. and Mrs. Blackstone were both natives of Ohio. They lived at that time at what is now known as Blue Island, Cook county, Ill. The family shortly removed to Thornton in same county, and later Bourbonnais township. The territory now

known as Kankakee had then few inhabitants except Indians, so Blackstone purchased a large tract of land and returned to Cook county, settling at Blackstone's Grove. Making their home there and at Thornton, they spent several years. Mr. Blackstone, Senior, went to Lockport about 1845, built a home and entered upon a mercantile venture with Hiram Norton. There he died in 1848.

In 1849, John S. Blackstone, whose name heads this brief history of a pioneer's life work, accompanied his mother and family to Kankakee county and located on a farm near the village. At that time he was seventeen years of age, and had been educated at Lockport. He spent six months in schooling in the old log school house at Bourbonnais, which, with a frame church, then constituted the entire village. He has followed farming all his life, has been a resident of this county for over claiming the county from its primitive wilder-claiming the country from its primitive wilderness, and in making it what it is to-day.

January 21, 1864, he was united in marriage with Miss Mary Jane Francis, the daughter of Abraham and Mary J. (Davison) Francis. Her father was a native of Ireland and her mother of Ohio. She was one of a family of eleven children, the others being named: Margaret L., William D., Allen, John, Lydia, Charles, Clara, Addle, George and Carrie.

Mr. and Mrs. Blackstone were the parents of four children, of whom we give the following brief mention: Addie Jane was born December 2, 1864, and departed this life August 17, 1904; Carrie Maria, born February 8, 1867, and passed to "the pale realms of the shades of death" November 16, 1875; Mary Francis, now the wife of Albert E. Hartley, of Goodland, Ind., born August 28, 1869, was married October 16, 1889, and is the mother of two children: Florence H. and Charles B.; John W.. the youngest child of Mr. and Mrs. Blackstone was born July 9. 1872, and manages his father's farm. He married Miss Enie Brunimer, April 5, 1898, and has a family of three interesting children: Willis J., William B and John D. They live in a comfortable house near his

In his political faith Mr. Blackstone adheres to the tenets of the republican party, although he never has sought public office. Religiously he is a member of the Methodist church.

BLANEY, ROBERT.-Among the older resi-

dents of Kankakee is Robert Blaney, whose life record furnishes a splendid example for emulation. Of limited financial circumstances in his youth and deprived of many of the advantages, educational and otherwise, which wealth can bring, he started out for himself, fully determined that success should crown his efforts, if it could be gained through honorable and persistent purpose.

Robert Blaney, a retired and opulent farmer, living at 25 Maple street, Kankakee, has been long identified with the life of the county, and is regarded as one of its leading and substantial citizens. He is well known and has the unbounded respect and esteem of the entire community.

Mr. Blaney is a native of Scotland and was born October 3, 1835, and is the son of Allan and Margaret (Wilson) Blaney, who were both born in the land of Scotia. His father was reared awl educated in his native land, and was a farmer by occupation, and died in the old country. The mother followed him in death a few years later. They were both Cameronian Presbyterians in their faith and devout and consistent Christian people. They had a family of eight children, of which the following is a record: The first was Rosetta, deceased; second, Sarah, resides in Kankakee; Isabella, deceased; Eliza, who lives in Scotland; Margaret J.; James, who died in the Post Hospital at Paducah, Kentucky, in 1864, a member of Company C, One Hundred and Thirty-fourth Illinois Infantry; Allan, who was in the United States a year and then returned to Scotland, and died when about twenty-five years of age; and Robert.

The latter was brought to America in 1848, when he was about twelve years of age and was educated in Kendall county, Illinois. As he grew older he was employed in farm labor for some four or five years, then, renting a piece of land, he started to till the soil on his own account.

On October 20, 1862, he was united in marriage with Miss Martha H. Howard, daughter of Rev. Hiram and Agnes T. (Clark) Howard: Mr. Howard was a Methodist minister of the Troy Conference, N. Y., a local preacher and land holder. He died in 1860 when but fifty years of age, but the mother reached the age of eighty-four before she was called away. In their family there were six children: Eliza,

who died in youth; Mary J., now Mrs. F. W. Bathrick of Boone, Ia.; John T. C., a farmer at Sterling, Neb.; Alma H. (Mrs. C. B. Lee), who died at Santa Anna, Cal., August 7, 1899, aged over sixty-four years; Martha H. (Mrs. Robert Blaney), and Alonzo V., a liveryman at Long Beach, Cal.

Mr. Blaney continued in Kane county and vicinity until March, 1866, when he moved to and settled near Chebanse, Ill. Here he purchased eighty acres of land, where he resided. As years passed he was successful and added to this from time to time, until he had acquired a handsome property, which he still owns.

In 1899 he removed to Kankakee where he has since resided; he has virtually retired from active participation In the more strenuous duties of life and is enjoying the fruits of his industry and economy in younger days.

Mr. Blaney is a member of the Masonic order and has filled the office of Worshipful Master, and has been a delegate to the Grand Lodge. He has always been interested in educational matters and served as clerk of a school board under the state superintendency of Dr. Newton Bateman, the author of the Historical Encyclopedia of Illinois. He is a republican in politics, casting his first vote for John C. Fremont in 1856 and for every candidate of that party ever since.

Mr. and Mrs. Blaney are the parents of five children: the eldest, Mary E., the wife of C. R. Wood, now living near Herscher, Ill.; Charles Elmer, a carpenter; Robert E., a practicing dentist in Chicago; George Arthur, a prosperous farmer near Chebanse, and Edith Agnes, a successful teacher and a graduate of the Kankakee High School class of 1901.

There are also six grandchildren: Fred H., Arthur L., Robert E., Ruth M. and Russel C. Wood; and Howard Blaney, only child of George and Cora Blaney.himself and satisfaction to the community; and in the

BOISVERT, JOSEPH L., retired farmer, ex-clerk of the circuit court and recorder, Kankakee, is a native of the county. -He has a wide circle of friends who all appreciate the natural worth and integrity of his character. Mr. Boisvert is a representative of one of Kankakee county's pioneer families. He was born in Bourbonnais township April 26, 1858, and is the son of Eli Boisvert. The latter is a native of Canada, and was born in 1830. He came to this country in 1844, located on a farm and carried on agricultural pursuits. He is still living at Bourbonnais. The mother of Joseph, Matilda (Legris) Boisvert, is also a native of Canada, and both she and her husband are of pure French descent. They were the parents of nine children of whom Joseph was the second. He was reared upon the paternal homestead, assisting in carrying on the general farm work. He drew his education from the schools of his native township, finishing at St. Viateur's College Bourbonnais. Like the untroubled stream, life has flowed peacefully on with him, giving him no rough experiences, and no hardships except those incident to hard work. He has always been a republican in political faith and has served his township town clerk two years, township treasurer six years, postmaster four years, and supervisor ten years previous to his election as circuit clerk and recorder in 1900. LEWIS & CLARK TRIVIA

With the Louisiana Purchase, President Thomas Jefferson made what was arguably the best land deal in history when he added 828,000 square miles to the U.S. at a cost of \$15 million, roughly 3 cents an acre.

Along the way, the explorers "discovered" 178 plant species and 122 animal species.

Six members of the expedition received court martials and two more deserted along the way. The last court martial was John Newman, who received 75 lashes.

Lewis committed suicide in 1809, three years after the expedition returned to St. Louis. He was 35.

Every member of the expedition had a landmark along the Lewis and Clark Trail named in his or her honor.

The expedition encountered 50 Indian tribes along their route.

French trapper Toussaint Charbonneau was paid \$500.33, one third for his services. Charbonneau actually had two Indian wives - Bird Woman (Sakakawea) and Otter Woman. Sakakawea became one of the most honored women in American history. She had named after her the largest reservoir on the Missouri, a state park in Washington, a river in Montana, a mountain pass and a peak.
