#### 1911 Canadian Census

The 1911 census has been released and digitized images can be consulted at the Library and Archives of Canada site,  
[www.collectionscanada.ca/archivianet/1911/index-e.html](http://www.collectionscanada.ca/archivianet/1911/index-e.html) The census is not indexed but the full entries (in digitized form) are given and there is a table of census districts and sub-districts to assist you in choosing the one you need.

#### Castle Garden

Now you can go on [hap: //castlegarden.org](http://castlegarden.org) and search a free online database of New York passenger lists from 1830 through 1913. The Battery Conservancy launched the 10 million name database and it includes passengers who were dropped off at the Battery before Castle Garden opened and 2,000 Ellis Island immigrants who aren't in the database at [www.ellisland.org](http://www.ellisland.org). Two million more immigrants are also expected to be added to the site. The free Quick Search lets you look for a first and last name and arrival date range. You can narrow your results by choosing a place of origin, occupation and ship. The search returns only exact matches, so you'll need to try spelling variations on your ancestor's name. Results show name, occupation, age, sex, arrival and ship's name.

Follow the site's Timeline link for a trip through Castle Garden's illustrious history starting as a military fort called the Southwest Battery. It was reincarnated as a prestigious performing arts venue, the immigrant processing station and an aquarium before designated a national monument bearing its 1817 name, Castle Clinton.

### **1883 KANKAKEE COUNTY DEATHS**

(29 Mar 1883) George C. Van Doren, editor and proprietor of the Buckingham News, died last Tuesday afternoon, of pneumonia, following an attack of measles, after an illness of one week. Mr. Van Doren was only 21 years of age, but had built up a remunerative business. He possessed determination, energy and integrity - qualities which succeed in any walk of life. His disposition was friendly and he had surrounded himself with friends who felt an interest in his opening career and predicted a useful

future for him. The universal sentiment of the community will be that of sincere mourning over the untimely death of young Van Doren.

**MOMENCE & VICINITY - 1883**

A telegram came from Chicago Monday night stating that Henry Vankirk was there very dangerously

sick. John Hanna' youngest boy, about eight years old, was badly bitten by his dog on the arm and leg last Monday.

**Mishaps at Momence - Kankakee Gazette March 22, 1883.**

Benjamin Hayhurst, living east of Momence, was drowned on Sunday afternoon in Bull creek. He and his son were in a boat, attempting to aid a man who was having difficulty with his team while fording the creek. The boat capsized and the elder Hayhurst was drowned. The son swam to shore.

The dwelling of Silas Metcalf, one-half mile east of Momence, was burned on Sunday. No particulars.

**SCHOOL MATTERS - 1883**

**Taken from the Kankakee Gazette, March 22, 1883.**

The regular meeting of the board of education was held last Monday evening. The finance committee reported that they had insured the school building, contents and outhouses for \$25,400 for a period of three years at two per cent. The building committee were instructed to report to the next meeting of the board the repairs which will be needed in the high school building this spring. The following bills were ordered paid:

Miss Small was granted the use of a recitation room for a drawing class. Prof. Tracy was requested to make out a revised set of school rules during vacation. The thanks of the board were tendered to Prof. Forbes, state entomologist, for a fine collection of rare specimens.

The average attendance and scholarship is said to be higher this year than ever before. The present school year promises to be fruitful in good results, and the board and the patrons of the schools are apparently well satisfied with the management of affairs.

**THE FATE OF THE 1890 CENSUS**

**Excerpts from the National Archives Website.**

As there was not a permanent Census Bureau until 1902, the Department of the Interior administered the Eleventh Census. The censuses of 1790 through 1880 required all or part of schedules to be filed in county clerk's offices. Ironically, this was not required in 1890 and the original copies of the schedules were forwarded to Washington.

June 1, 1890, was the official census date, and all responses were to reflect the status of the household on that date. The 1890 census law allowed enumerators to distribute schedules in advance and later



gather them up (as was done in England), supposedly giving individuals adequate time to accurately provide information. As in other censuses, if an individual was absent, the enumerator was authorized to obtain information from the person living nearest the family.

The U.S. population was returned at nearly 63 million. Complaints about accuracy and undercounting poured into the census office as did demands for recounts. In March, 1896, before final publication of all general statistics volumes, the original 1890 special schedules for mortality, crime, pauperism and benevolence, special classes and portions of the transportation and insurance schedules were badly damaged by fire and destroyed by Department of the Interior order. No damage to the general population schedules was reported at that time. These schedules were stored in an unlocked file room in the basement of the Commerce Building despite ongoing requests by the Secretary of Commerce and others for an archives building.

At about 5 p.m. on January 10, 1921, building fireman James Foster noticed smoke coming through openings around pipes that ran from the boiler room into the file room. Foster saw no fire but immediately reported the smoke to the desk watchman, who called the fire department. Minutes later, on the 5' floor, a watchman noticed smoke in the men's bathroom, took the elevator to the basement, was forced back by the dense smoke, and went to the watchman's desk. By then the fire department had arrived, the house alarm was pulled and a dozen employees still working on upper floors evacuated. A total of three alarms and a general local call were turned in.

After some setbacks from the intense smoke, firemen attained access to the basement. While a crown of ten thousand watched, they poured twenty streams of water into the building and flooded the cellar through holes cut into the concrete floor. The fire did not go above the basement, seemingly thanks to a fireproofed floor. By 9:45 p.m. the fire was extinguished, but firemen poured water into the burned area past 10:30 p.m. With the blaze extinguished, everyone went home.

The morning after was an archivist's nightmare, with ankle-deep water covering records in many areas. Although the basement vault was considered fireproof and watertight, water seeped through a broken wired-glass panel in the door and under the floor, damaging some earlier and later census schedules on the lower tiers. The 1890 census, however, was stacked outside the vault and was, according to one source, "first in the path of the firemen". That morning, Census Director Sam Rogers reported the extensive damage to the 1890 schedules, estimating 25 percent destroyed, with 50 percent of the remainder damaged by water, smoke and fire. Salvage of the water soaked and charred documents might be possible, reported the bureau, but saving even a small part would take a month, and it would take two to three years to copy off and save all the records damaged in the fire.

The total number of damaged vault volumes numbered 8,919, of which 7,957 were from the 1910 census. Rogers estimated that 10 percent of these vault schedules would have to be "opened and dried, and some of them recopied." Thankfully, the census schedules of 1790-1820 and 1850-1870 were on the fifth floor of the Commerce Building and reportedly not damaged. The new 1920 census was housed in a temporary building at Sixth and B Streets, SW, except for some of the nonpopulation schedules being used on the fourth floor.

Speculation and rumors about the cause of the blaze ran rampant. Some believed the fire started among shavings in the carpenter shop or was the result of spontaneous combustion. No conclusion as to the cause was reached. The disaster spurred renewed cries and support for a National Archives. Meanwhile, the still soggy "charred about the edges" original and only copies of the 1890 schedules remained in ruins. At the end of January, the records damaged in the fire were moved for temporary storage. By May of 1921 the records were still piled in a large warehouse where, complained new census director William Steuart, they could not be consulted and would probably gradually deteriorate. Steuart arranged for their transfer back to the census building, to be bound where possible, but at least put in some order for reference.

The extant record is scanty on storage and possible use of the 1890 schedules between 1922 and 1932 and seemingly silent on what precipitated the following chain of events. In December, 1932, in

accordance with federal records procedures at the time, the Chief Clerk of the Bureau of Census sent the Librarian of Congress a list of papers no longer necessary for current business and scheduled for destruction. He asked the Library to report back to him any documents that should be retained for their historical interest. Item 22 on the list for Bureau of the Census read "Schedules, Population.... 1890, Original". The Librarian identified no records as permanent, the list was sent forward, and Congress authorized destruction on February 21, 1933. At least one report states the 1890 census papers were finally destroyed in 1935, and a small scribbled note found in a Census Bureau file states "remaining schedules destroyed by Department of Commerce in 1934 (not approved by the Geographer)". Ironically, just one day before Congress authorized destruction of the 1890 census papers, President Herbert Hoover laid the cornerstone for the National Archives Building.

In 1942 the National Archives accessioned a damaged bundle of surviving Illinois schedules as part of a shipment of records found during a Census Bureau move. At the time, they were believed to be the only surviving fragments. In 1953, however, the Archives accessioned an additional set of fragments. These sets of extant fragments are from Alabama, Georgia, Illinois (McDonough County), Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, South Dakota, Texas and the District of Columbia (3 rolls). The surviving 1890 population schedules have no fewer than 6,160 names.

Jason Robinson, who has been quite sick, is on the gain. F. X. Fraser and Stephen Cyrier's families are down with the measles.

D. H. Mitchel having rented his farm, will have a public sale on the 16'. Walter Mann and Fred Grimes are preparing to start for Dakota some time during the week. John McIntosh will start for Nebraska next week.

W. L. Mann has moved on the farm he recently purchased of Daniel Durham. Hamlin Smith has moved on to the farm he bought of E. R. Durham. Daniel Durham and E. R. Durham having sold their farm have moved their families to Kankakee until they secure a location in some portion of the West. These men have been residents of our town since 1865 and it is with regret that we part with them. Wherever they go for a new home our best wishes go with them, and we highly recommend them to their new neighbors.

On last Wednesday the last sad rites were performed over the remains of Mrs. O. A. Sampsel. The services were conducted by the Rev. Mr. Beaty at the United Brethren church at 1 o'clock p.m., where a large concourse of friends, relatives, neighbors and former scholars gathered to see the remains laid at rest. The remains were inclosed in a beautiful rosewood casket with a silver plate on which were the simple words "at rest". Over the casket was a large cross with wreaths of fresh flowers. Eleven years ago the past winter, the deceased and O. A. Sampsel were married in church during the evening services. Thus the idol of an hour is shattered and broken and gone to the rest from which there is no awakening. Mrs. Sampsel was a kind and faithful neighbor, loved by all who knew her, and so long as those who knew her live, so long will her memory be fresh.

Mr. Brock settled on his present farm, which he rented until 1866, and then bought for fifteen dollars an acre. He owns one hundred and sixty acres, all of which is under cultivation, and is devoted to general produce, horses, cattle and hogs. The Brock farm is one of the best equipped in the township, and from its general atmosphere of thrift and neatness one may learn valuable lessons in the art of country home building. March 4, 1878, Mr. Brock was visited by a crushing grief in the death of his wife and helpmate, to whose un-failing cheerfulness and sympathy he owed much of the success thus far achieved. Of this union there were ten children: Mary J., born August 30, 1859, died February 28, 1878; Carrie C., born March 11, 1861, died January 6, 1877; William J., born April 20, 1862, a prominent attorney of Kankakee, Ill.; Samuel J., born January 24, 1864, now managing his father's farm; Alice M., born January 12, 1866, died September 23, 1897; Anna E., born November 23, 1867, the wife of George Meier, a farmer of Iroquois county, Ill.; Charlotte M., born June 30, 1870, living at home; Emma E., born March 12, 1872, the wife of Edward McIntosh, of Kankakee; Dora C., born January 16, 1874, died February 18, 1876; and Nellie, born June 15, 1876, died August 16, 1876.

Mr. Brock takes an active interest in politics and education, and has held many of the most desirable offices within the gift of his fellow townspeople. He is a democrat, and as such has served as supervisor of Otto township for thirteen consecutive years, and for years has held responsibilities which enabled him to shape materially the school policy of the county. He is liberal minded, however, and often votes for the best man regardless of party connections. He is a highly respected, practical and substantial man, and his career has reflected many sided credit upon the growing fortunes of Otto township.

BROCK, WILLIAM no profession is there a career more open to talent than that of the law. And in no field of endeavor is there demanded a more careful preparation, a more thorough appreciation of the absolute ethics of life or of the underlying principle which form the basis of human rights and privileges. Un-flagging application and intuitive wisdom and adetermination to fully utilize the means at

hand are the concomitants which insure personal success, and prestige in this greatest profession which stands as the stern conservator of justice, possessing all the requisite qualities of the able lawyer. Mr. Brock is today among] the most prominent and influential members of the Kankakee bar and there is perhaps none of whom the editors of this work feel a greater degree of pleasure in laying out their life struggles than that of the gentleman whose name heads this brief memoir. Born to comparative adverse circumstances his manful battle to push himself to the front, is worthy of high commendation as he has fought his way to a high position entirely by his own efforts.

Mr. Brock is a native of Kankakee county, born in Otto township, April 20, 1862. His father, John Brock, was a native of England, who, when a young man emigrated to America in order to seek in the New World that opportunity denied him at home. He came to Illinois in 1854 and settled in Will county, where he engaged in farming until 1861 when he removed to Kankakee county. He had married in Will county and the following year brought his family here, and settled on a farm in Otto township. His wife, born Miss Hannah Bird, was a native of Peterborough, Ontario, Canada. Her parents were of English birth, her grandfather having served in the British army. She came to Will county in 1845, and died here in 1878.

Mr. Brock was the third of ten children born, to his parents, and the eldest of five now living. His first schooling he derived from his most excellent mother and followed this by educational advantages in the common schools of his locality. He began teaching at an early age and made a most acceptable pedagogue. With higher thoughts than the mere "teaching the young idea how to shoot," he took up the study of law. This he pursued through thick and thin, through various adverse circumstances, burning the midnight oil. Feeling the necessity of supplementing his labors in study in the field of labor, he took up newspaper work in the summer of 1888, and soon purchased a half interest in the Kankakee Democrat. In 1890 he acquired the other interest and became sole owner. Two years later he sold the whole property and resumed

his legal studies. In 1893, on proper examination he was admitted to the bar and commenced the practice of law in Kankakee. By dint of indomitable perseverance and rare industry he has pushed his way to the front ranks and is one of the foremost members of the bar of this section of the state. The zeal with which he has devoted his energies to his profession, his fidelity to the interests of his clients, his careful preparation of cases and forceful presentation of his cause before the court or jury have brought him a large business and made him very successful in its conduct. He is always courteous and deferential toward the court, kind and forbearing toward his adversaries. He examines a witness carefully and thoroughly, but treats him with respect, which makes the witness grateful. His analysis of the facts is clear and exhaustive and he seems to see without effort the relation and dependence of the points of the case, so grouping them as to enable him to throw their combined force upon the point they tend to prove. In January, 1905, Mr. Brock formed a law partnership with Judge John Small and the firm have had full charge of the work of securing the right of way through this county for the Chicago-Southern, Illinois, Iowa & Minnesota and Chicago & Southern Traction Company railways, three new railroads just being built. The prominent part that Mr. Brock took

all the condemnation suits growing out of this work and the successful termination thereof speaks well for him.

Mr. Brock and Miss Clara McIntosh were united in marriage December 25th, 1889. The lady is a daughter of the late S. H. and Catherine McIntosh. They are the parents of five children: Carrie, Myrtle, Florence, Helen, and John H. Mr. Brock is very active in local affairs; is connected with the Kankakee District Fair Association, of which he is treasurer, and the Kankakee Pure Milk & Cold Storage Co. In politics he takes much interest and is a republican. He is a member of the Masonic fraternity, being a member of the Blue Lodge, the American Union, and Independent Order of Foresters; also member of Royal Arcanum. His reputation as an energetic, pushing member of the community is recognized everywhere that he is known. He is one of the best read men in the county.

BROOKS, WINDLE G.—An instance of a man who has gone out to meet opportunity, who has

had the alertness to recognize it, and the foresight to develop it, is found in Windle G. Brooks, the village attorney of St. Anne. Mr. Brooks is a native son of Illinois, and was born on a farm in Otto township, Kankakee county, June 5, 1861. He is of Scotch-German ancestry, a son of Francis H. and Virginia C. (Grove) Brooks, natives of New York and Indiana respectively.

In early life a farmer, Francis H. Brooks later turned his attention to educational work, and for twenty-seven years taught in the schools of St. Anne, Bourbonnais, Kankakee, and Aroma. He was widely and favorably known, held various republican elective offices, and took a keen interest in promoting the cause of Masonry throughout the state. As a member of the Christian church he proved a faithful servant and generous contributor, and his life, rounded out by large usefulness, moral rectitude, and mental ideals, contributed in no small measure to the establishment of noble standards of thought and labor in the communities in which he lived. August 9, 1860, he was united in marriage to Virginia C. Grove, who was born in Indiana November 24, 1840, and who died March 21, 1884. Mrs. Brooks was a member of long standing of the Methodist Episcopal church, in which faith she reared her three children, of whom Windle G. is the oldest. Her oldest daughter, Helen P., is the wife of Thomas Dalton, traveling engineer for the Iron Mountain Railroad, and her other daughter, Mary Virginia, who was born June 4, 1875, was the deceased wife of Fred Brown. Francis Brooks died October 12, 1878, at the age of fifty-three years, having been born June 3, 1825.

One of the most encouraging lessons to be learned from the rise of Windle G. Brooks, is that education is within the reach of all who seriously desire it. His father, the schoolmaster, was a man of limited means, and the youth found his education at a standstill after he had completed the training in the public schools of Aroma and Kankakee. At the age of twenty he began teaching in the village, and later he taught in the township of Aroma and at St. Anne, and with the money thus earned he entered the Wesleyan University at



Bloomington, Illinois. In 1888 he graduated from the law department of the same institution. and for the following eight years taught school in different parts of the county, succeeding well, as he remained a long time in each place. Mr. Brooks began the practice of law in St. Anne in 1897, and since has been connected with the majority of important cases which have come up in the courts. He now is serving his third term as justice of the peace.

December 24, 1884, Mr. Brooks married Ella Legg, a native of Kankakee county, and daughter of Lorenzo Dan Legg. Lorenzo Legg was one of the early and prominent pioneers of Kankakee county. and a farmer whose labors netted him large landed possessions, which land still is the home of several of his children. of whom he had three sons and three daughters. Mr. Legg was twice married, his first wife being Miss Lowe, sister of Peter Lowe of this county. His death occurred in 1893, at the age of seventy-seven years. Mr. and Mm. Brooks are the parents of three children. of whom Zella is a teacher in the public schools of Kankakee county. and Carrie and Windle G., Jr., are living at home. Mr. Brooks is fraternally identified with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, of which he is Past Grand, and with the Modern Woodmen of America. He is one of the astute and painstaking lawyers of the county, a constant student of men and affairs, and the owner of a law library which compares favorably with any in the county. honorable means of adjusting the legal complications of his clients has won him the confidence of the community. and his tact. consideration. and all-around good fellowship have added to his appreciators many warm and dependable friends.

BROWN, BYRON W.—The sterling worth and reliable business qualities of Byron W. Brown find an outlet as the proprietor of a drugstore, and manager of the Central Union Telephone Exchange, at Grant Park. Mr. Brown is a native son of Illinois, and represents one of its pioneer families, his parents, Roland and Artimissa (Vial) Brown, having come to Will county from Pennsylvania during the early '60's. Besides Byron, who was born on the Will county farm May 18, 1872, there were five other children, four of whom are

living. Emma A., the oldest daughter, lives at home with her mother in Kankakee, as does also Barrett A., while Charles R., who married Miss Mamie Wood, is employed as rate clerk in the office of the I. I. & I. Railroad in Kankakee.

Mr. Brown received his preliminary education in the country schools of Will county, and later graduated from the Kankakee high school. Developing a liking for pharmacy, he entered the National Institute of Pharmacy at Chicago, graduating there in April, 1894. Until 1898 he clerked in a drugstore in Kankakee, at that time laying aside business cares and taking a trip through the north and west, visiting among other places, California and Alaska. Returning to Kankakee during the fall of 1899, he went the following spring to Chicago, where he clerked in a drugstore until April, 1901. Coming to Grant Park soon after, he bought out the drug supply of Sines & Stanley, and since has added a stock of jewelry, school supplies and stationery, catering to an increasingly appreciative and remunerative trade. He has a thorough understanding of his business, is affable and obliging, and succeeds in making his store one of the most popular and pleasant in the town.

At Momence, Illinois, October 29, 1902, Mr. Brown married Emma E. Gelino, who was born in Kankakee county, July 22, 1882, the daughter of Frank Gelino, of Momence. Fraternally Mr. Brown is connected with the Grant Park Lodge, No. 867, I. O. O. F. He seeks no honors outside of those due the upright and sagacious business man, and in politics is liberal-minded enough to vote for the man, rather than the party he represents.

BROWN, JOHN ARCHIBALD, M. D.—The most enlightened tenets of medical and surgical science find expression in the career of Dr. John Archibald Brown, a general practitioner of Kankakee since 1901. More than the average educational and professional advantages contribute to the success of Dr. Brown, and that he has known how best to use them is due possibly in large measure to the qualities of concentration and perseverance inherited from a worthy Scotch ancestry. His early ambitions unfolded in the town of Sar-

ilia, capital of Lambton county, Ontario, Canada, on the St. Clair river, where he was born February 22, 1870. Hither had come in their youth his parents, Charles and Margaret (Wilson) Brown, from Glasgow, Scotland, the place of their birth and early training. They now are living retired in Sarnia.

After graduating from the high school at Sarnia, Dr. Brown took a literary course at the Toronto University and thereafter entered the medical department of the McGill University, Montreal, from which he was duly graduated in 1893. Continuing with the university as house surgeon for a year after his graduation, he entered upon the practice of medicine in Buckingham, Kankakee county, continuing thus for five years. For the following two years he matriculated and studied in the University of Berlin, Germany, and upon returning to America, located in Kankakee in 1901. On Thanksgiving day of the following year he was united in marriage to Violet H. Palmer, a native of St. Catharines, Lincoln county, Ontario, a daughter of Dr. A. E. Palmer, a practicing physician of Chicago, Illinois. Mrs. Brown is a graduate of the Woman's Medical College of Chicago, class of 1898, and for two years was a member of the staff of the Eastern Illinois Hospital for the Insane at Kankakee.

Dr. Brown is a member and the secretary of the Kankakee county Medical Society and a member of the State Medical Society and the American Medical Association. He finds a religious home in the Baptist church, his wife affiliating with the Episcopal church. To profound professional acumen Dr. Brown adds a personality which inspires confidence, a heart which responds to the opportunities for well doing irrespective of financial returns, and a manner courteous, sympathetic and invariably kind.

BROWN, SAMUEL H.—Few of the early families of Kankakee county are better represented in its second generation, both among its retired and active citizens, than that established here by Erasmus D. and Lettic (Loughry) Brown, the former born in New York state in 1808. This worthy couple to whom, in early life, came the desire to travel west and ally their fortunes with its undeveloped strength, left their native New Yorkstate and settled in the wilderness of what then was St. Anne, but now is Pembroke township,

Kankakee county. Loneliness and deprivation were their portion, for they had little of this world's goods, and there were few neighbors to whom they could turn for counsel or sympathy. Nevertheless, they had grit and determination, and their farm yielded of its fertility in response to their untiring labors. With the passing of years their family increased, until seven children played around their hearthstone. Of these, Jane is the deceased wife of John Woods; Elizabeth also is deceased; Emily is the wife of Tobias Hannon, and lives on a farm near Madison, Nebraska; Sarah lives at Allerton, Iowa; Ellen is the widow of Thomas Hannon, and lives at St. Anne; Rosilla is the wife of Thomas O'Connell, a farmer near Momence; and Samuel H. is a farmer of St. Anne. Erasmus D. Brown lived to be an old man, and died with the assurance that he had won the respect and good will of his neighbors and associates.

Samuel H. Brown, the youngest child of the pioneer, and one of the successful and substantial farmers of St. Anne township, was born on his father's farm in Pembroke township, November 24, 1846. His school advantages were those of the log cabin age, and he has learned more from observation than from the perusal of books. Through his marriage at St. Anne to Delia O'Connell, daughter of Daniel and Catherine O'Connell, he became allied with another pioneer family of the county. Mr. Brown brought his wife to his father's farm, upon which he since has continued to reside, and which he now owns in his own right. The farm is located on section 2, St. Anne township, and in extent is three hundred and twenty acres of finely improved and very fertile land. He is engaged in general farming and stock-raising, and has made some good improvements, besides having a comfortable home and large, well-constructed barns.

Mr. Brown is a staunch adherent of republican principles, and while a school director of St. Anne township for nine years, did much to raise the general standard of education. To himself and wife have been born six children: Charles D., the strong and capable son who assists in the management of the farm; Nettie,

the wife of Thomas Golding, of Momence; and Samuel H., Rosa, Thomas D., and Cora, all of whom are living at home. Mr. Brown is an industrious and painstaking farmer, a kind neighbor, and public-spirited citizen.

BROWN, THOMAS PATRICK, the assistant agent of the Illinois Central Railroad at Kankakee, is a native of this city, having been born in the house where he now lives, No. 161 Fourth avenue, November 26, 1873. He is the son of Rody and Bridget (Kennedy) Brown, both natives of County Waterford, Ireland. The father came to America about 1861 and settled near Toronto, Canada. Later he removed to Troy, New York, where he was married January 4, 1871, and shortly after came west and made his home in Kankakee until the day of his death. He was a good, conscientious faithful worker and filled several positions in the employ of the Illinois Central railroad. His last place was that of bridge-tender on the structure across the Kankakee river, and he held it at the time he was called away by death, May 25, 1890, when fifty-one years of age. He was a member of the Catholic church and of the Catholic Order of Foresters. His wife resides in the same house mentioned above.

Thomas P. Brown is the second of eight children born to his parents, the others being as follows: Michael, died in 1887, when sixteen years of age; John, died in 1891 aged fifteen years; David, freight clerk in the Illinois Central Railroad office at Kankakee; Mary, Katie and Nellie attending St. Joseph's Seminary; and Rody, now stenographer for the Curtis Brick Company, at Grant Park, Kankakee county. The boys were educated at the public and at the Brothers' school, Thomas with the rest. Attaining his education, he took upon himself life's duties, entering the employ of the Illinois Central Railroad in the Kankakee office. This was in 1886. His faithful performance of the duties imposed on him, and the inborn industry of the youth impressed those in authority, and he has continued in the employ of the company ever since, being promoted from time to time as there was occasion. He was given his present situation in 1896 and has held it ever since.

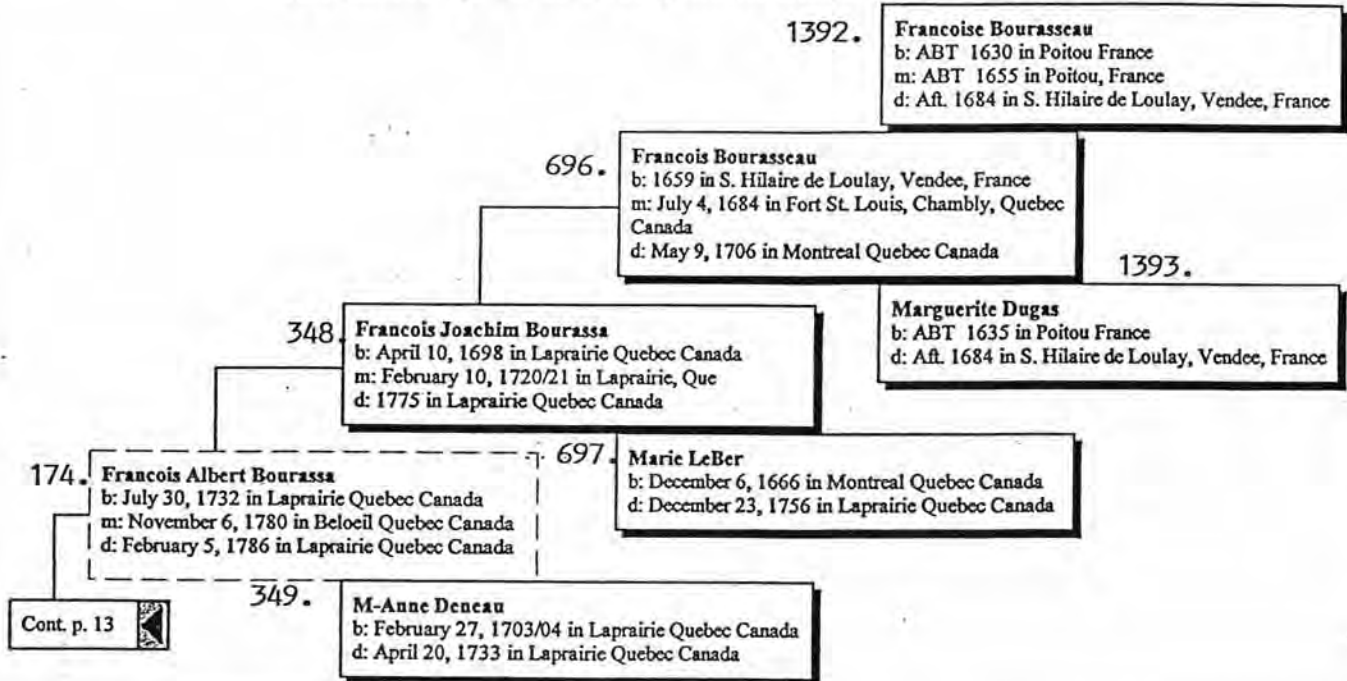
BROWN, WILLIAM O.—Not the least of the

business qualifications of William O. Brown is the faculty of seeing and utilizing the opportunities at hand. Proof of his sagacity in this regard is the grain and elevator business established by him in Chebanse in 1898, and which since has far exceeded his own and others' expectations as a factor of encouragement in the grain-raising industry of this section. In March, 1901, Mr. Brown became still further involved in the business upbuilding of his adopted town, establishing a partnership with Jules Gravelot, a hardware store, which, however, was burned to the ground January 3, 1904, entailing a small loss. Also, he is engaged in the cement sidewalk business with Mr. Gravelot, his operations extending throughout this and adjoining counties. Mr. Brown is a prominent republican, and is at present school director of Chebanse, having held a similar position in Norton township for several years. Fraternally he is connected with the Masons, the Knights of Pythias, and the Modern Woodmen of America.

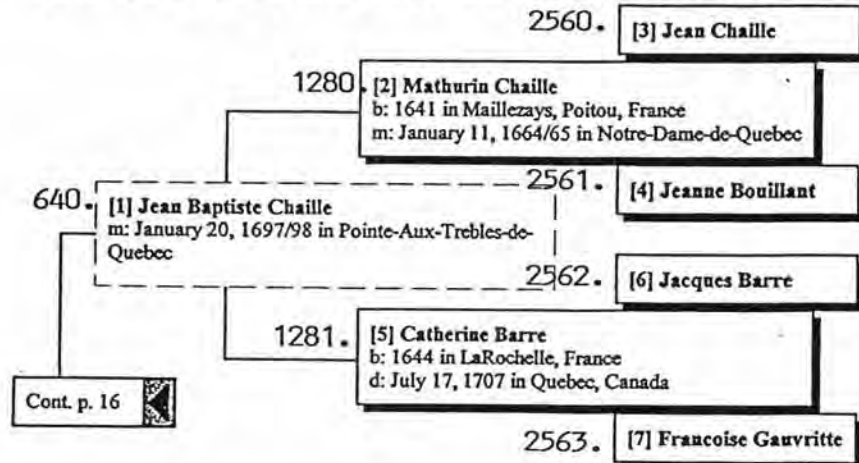
The solid worth of Mr. Brown rests not merely upon his capacity for business, and for enlisting the best efforts of his subordinates, but upon a practical and thorough education, acquired in the public schools of Chebanse, at the Valparaiso Normal of Valparaiso, Indiana, and at Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio. His traits of character are those of English-Scotch and German ancestors. Born on a farm in Kendall county, Illinois, April 3, 1862, he is a son of Elijah W. and Jeanette (Barker) Brown, natives of New York and Vermont respectively. Elijah Brown was born at Cooperstown, N. Y., in 1826, and was a son of Allen and Mahala (Dingman) Brown, natives of that state. Allen Brown married in New York and moved thence to Kendall county, Ill., about 1860, his wife dying there in 1872. He subsequently became a farmer in Kankakee county, residing latterly with his son Elijah W., until his death in 1887. He had seven children besides Elijah, who was the fourth oldest. The children were Peter, Ann. Salina, Hannah, Ann, Matilda and Rose.

Elijah W. Brown was educated in the public schools of New York, and in early life was an educator, pursuing that occupation in his native state for several years, and continuing

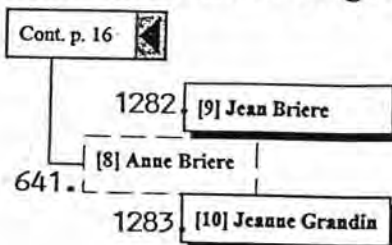
*Ancestors of Francis Raymond Chigbrow (24 of 26)*
