CHEBANSE, ANT EPITOME OF EVENTS, DATES AND FACTS, CONCERNING THE EARLY HISTORY OF CHEBANSE. SKETCHES OF EARLY SETTLERS WHO WERE LOCATED HERE BEFORE THE ORGANIZATION OF THE TOWNSHIP ORGANIZATION-FIRST OFFICERS. BUILDING OF THE ICRR-LAYING OUT OF CHEBANSE IN 1854. HISTORY OF THE FIRST BUSINESSMEN AND VARIOUS CHANGES UP TO THE PRESENT TIME. SCHOOLS, CHURCHES, SOCIETIES, SOCIAL ORGANIZATIONS, ETC.

#### TOWN INCORPORATION

Chebanse was incorporated under the old law in '68. A meeting was held July 9, at which R. NATION presided and G. W. BINFORD was clerk, for the purpose of voting for or against incorporation. The result of the election was 15 to 7 in favor of incorporating. The first election of trustees took place July 17, at which election S. ROBINSON, H. HUCKINGS, R. NATION, R. S. LAUGHLING and James ROBINSON were elected. S. A. ROBINSON was chosen president and T. S. SAWYER, clerk; P. W. TRACEY, constable and T. BABCOX, street commissioner. The town received a special charter, March 13, '69. May 13, '74, a petition was presented to the board to call an election to vote for, or against reorganization as a village under the general act of '72. The election was held May 29, and resulted in favor of reorganization by a vote of 32 to 28. The following are the present village officers: E. W. BROWN, BURRILL, GROSSE, JUNEAU, KINNEY, and TRESCOTT, trustees; R. J. EYERLEY, clerk, Geo. W. BURNS, treas., G. H. ALLEN, street commissioner, A. S. VEEDER, fire warden. The village has always license, at presents, \$300 per annum. The following have served as post masters: Mr. SEAVERS, A.M. FISHBURN, Mr. HITCHCOCK, Mary LINSEY, T. D. WILLIAMS, L. A. BRISTOL, A. M. WILSON, Joe. LEONARD, R. J. HANNA and E. S. RICHMOND. W. J. HUNTER succeeded RICHMOND and is still postmaster. In '79 this office was made a money order office.

#### PRESENT BUSINESS HOUSES

#### MILK'S STORE

Milk's block was commenced in the fall of 1867, and when completed, was occupied by MILK & POTTER, general merchandise; J. W. SFIFT & Co., merchant tailers; C. C. SARGEANT, druggist; and A. KERR & Co., hardware. The hardware store was in charge of J. ROBINS. Jan. 1, 1871, Mr. MILK became soul proprietor of the entire butiness in the block, and the several departments were in charge of the following gentlemen: E. G. FISH, authorized agent; A. L. TUCKER, cashier; Jerome BARD, groceries; W. W. GIBSON, drugs; and Frank POTTER, Hardware. Mr. MILK has been the proprietor of the store ever since, although the old corps of clerks have sought new fields of labor while others have taken their place. The following gentlemen now have charge of the store: Frank HENNESSY, commence in the month of June,

1873; F. F. PORTER, engaged as cashier, March 1877 and continued as such until Feb. 1881, when he took charge of Mr. MILK's farm books and assumes the position as private secretary of Mr. MILK: his place being filled as cashier by Frank HUCKINS; Wm. LAMB put on his "biled rag" and bagan cleaning lamps and washing butter tubs, in September 1879; A. BABCOX, commenced clerking for McKEE & BARD, remained with them about two years, when he changed to the Combination Store, Jan. 1882; J. D. KELLEY, who now has charge of the hardware department, succeeded Mr. WILLIAMS in Oct. 1882. Mr. KELLEY is well known in this community as a first-class tinner and hardware man having been in the employ of Jas. PORCH for a number of years.

The Combination Store is well supplied in every department and their stock is the best that can be had, while the clerks are all present and agreeable gentlemen to deal with.

#### L. A. KINNEY

moved to Chebanse 1868. Engaged in the agricultural business, in partnership with L. E. SAWYR, under the firm name of SAWYER & KINNEY. One year later Mr. SAWYER was succeeded by Geo. C. MEDBURY. In January 1875, Mr. KINNEY sold his interest to Mr. MEDBURY and bought the grain house of A. J. FOORD and engaged in the grain business, which pursuit he has followed with flattering success. He also handles hard and soft coal, lime, etc. On account of the increase in his business he has rented the north warehouse, recently occupied by MILK & CHASE, in which he will handle the bulk of the grain while he will use his warehouse in the south part of town as a seed house. Mr. KINNEY is an excellent citizen, and has held many positions of trust and honor during his residence in this place.

#### HENRY GROSSE

moved from Ottawa, Ill., in the fall of 1866, and opened a boot and shoe store, which he continued till 1873, when he and his brother Frank, bought the general store of their brother Jno. F. GROSSE, which they continued until 1878, when there were succeeded by J. W. PARKER, who closed out the stock. GROSSE Bros. moved to Chicago, remained there but a short time, when they returned to Herscher, and again opened a general store. The firm dissolved in 1881 when Henry came to this place and reopened a general store in the building formerly occupied by the firm. His stock is replete in every respect, he carries the finest of goods that can be found in this section.

#### JAS. CAPEN & CO.

Jas. CAPEN became a part in the business with F. J. TAYLOR, in 1872, and the first year that he done business in Chebanse, the firm handled over 1,000,000 bushels of grain. F. J. TAYLOR sold his interest to Mr. CAPEN, in 1873, and the same year A.B. CHASE became a partner in the business, under the firm name of CAPEN & CHASE. Mr. CHASE was succeeded by A. MARSHALL, in 1877. Jas. CAPEN & Co., also deal in hay, that branch of their business at this place and St. Anne is under the charge of R. S. KNICKERBOCKER. Besides their grain business in Chebanse, they also have houses in Donovan, St. Mary, St. Anne, Irwin, Cabery and Buckingham.

#### CHARLES OVERHEU

came to Chebanse, from Kankakee, in the fall of 1877, and bought the building he now occupies, of J. S. GREEN. He carries a good line of furniture, manufacturing the most of it himself, which is a sufficient guarantee of the quality and durability of his goods.

#### RIETZ BROS.

Dealers in lumber, lath, shingles, sash, doors, blinds, etc. This firm established themselves in Chebanse, September 16, 1875, and the business has been under charge of Mr. G. OERTEL ever since. They also handle an excellent quality of salt, which is skipped directly from their own salt wells in Manistee, Mich.

#### GEO. C. HUNTER

engaged in the photograph business with E. H. FARLEY, in the fall of 1872, and succeeded Mr. F. soon thereafter. His gallery is over McKEE & BARD's store, and is one of the best galleries we know of; he has succeeded in establishing the well deserved reputation of being the best photographer in this section of the country. His work can't be beat anywhere.

#### HENRY SIPPEL

came to Chebanse, in 1875, and engaged in the harness business the same year, in partnership with C. JUSTESON, under the firm name of JUSTESON & SIPPEL. Dissolved partnership in 1877, Mr. J. retiring. Mr. SIPPEL keeps a complete line of harness, saddles, collars, whips, robes, blankets, brushes, harness oil, etc., and turns out as fine work as can be had anywhere.

#### JAS. McPHERSON

commenced business in his mother's restaurant and confectionary store, on the east side of the railroad, in 1872. In 1880 moved to the present location, and when Mrs. McPHERSON died, Nov. 12, 1881, James took charge of the store. He carries a good line of canned goods, cigars, tobaccos, nuts, candies, crackers and etc. Oysters and fruit in season.

#### C. JANISH

came to Chebanse last summer, and opened a tailoring establishment in the HATTING building. He has a good patronage and guarantees his work to give satisfaction.

#### F. J. JUNEAU

arrived in Chebanse, Aug. 15, 1870, built the shop which he now

occupies, excepting additions which he has built on from time to time as his business increased. Mr. J. built his residence in 1872, and in the spring of 1882, engaged in the agricultural business. By close attention to business he has succeeded and accumulated a nice little property, and has the confidence and esteem of the public generally.

#### W. H. BALLARD

has been in Chebanse only about two years, but has succeeded in establishing for himself the enviable reputation of being a first-class dentist in every respect. His work always gives perfect satisfaction, and those who have had occasion to patronize him, do not hesitate in recommending him to others who need anything done in this line. New sets of teeth made in the neatest manner. Gold fillings a specialty. All work warranted.

#### F. J. SCHOKELT

moved to Chebanse in 1875, worked for Mr. JUNEAU two years and five months; in 1877 formed a partnership with F. KEGEBEIN, under the firm name of SCHOKELT & KEGEBEIN, and engaged in the wagon and blacksmith business. In 1880, the firm dissolved. Mr. S. continuing the business. He is an upright, industrious and hard working man, and certainly deserves the confidence the people repose in him.

#### **DEVELING & SYKES**

Dealers in agricultural implements, barbed wire, etc. J. M. DEVELING has been in the business since 1878, when he engaged with his brother William, under the firm name of DEVELING Bros. In the spring of 1882, William DEVELING retired and was succeeded by Mr. Oscar SYKES in the fall of 1882, and the firm is now DEVELING & SYKES. They handle many of the best machinery, including the Champion reapers and mowers, and hope by fair dealing to meet a share of the public patronage.

#### A. S. VEEDER

came to Chebanse, 1873, and worked in L. MILK's hardware and tin shop. Mr. VEEDER is a first class worker, and a pleasant gentleman to deal with. He is now running a tin shop in the same building occupied by his wife as a millinery store.

#### ROOT & SON

succeeded J. J. WALRATH, in the restaurant business in the fall of 1877. They keep a fine line of cigars, candies, etc., and have the reputation of setting the best table on the line of the I.C.R.R. Boarding by the day or week at reasonable rates.

#### M. HALEY

The oldest blacksmith in Chebanse, came to this place in the month of March, 1860, and established himself on the corner, south of his present residence but a few years ago moved to his present location on the county line.

#### GEO. RITTER

moved to Chebanse, Oct. 15, 1872, and has continued in the harness and saddlery trade up to the present time. He is now disposing of his stock at cost, preparatory to moving west.

#### MRS. A. S. VEEDER

established a millinery and dressmaking store in 1873 and has continued in the business up to the present time, although she has changed her location several times. She is now located first door north of the post office. She is a reliable dressmaker, and also carries a nice stock of millinery, jewelry, notions, corsets, etc.

#### J. P. H. TRESCOTT

moved to this place, in 1857, settled south-east of town; and soon after, moved to Sugar Island, where he taught school for three succesive winters, when he moved to town, in 1860, opened a meat market in September, which he continued till 1867, when he was succeeded by M. J. EYERLEY. He was elected Justice of the Peace and school Trustee, in April, 1862, and has held both offices up to the present time. He does an insurance and general collecting business, real estate agent, etc. His office is on the east side of the railroad, opposite the depot.

#### J. D. DEVELING

came to Chebanse, in the summer of 1851, and located at Sugar Island, where he practised medicine for two years. He then moved to this town and in 1864, opened a small drug store in connection with his practise.

For several years he was the only physician in this place. His practise increased to such an extent, that constant exposure traveling over the prairies brought on asthma which caused him to abandon a large portion of his practice. He procured the assistance Dr. THOMSON, whom he introduced to his patrons. In the year 1869,

he took C. C. SARGEANT into parnership with him in the drug business. In 1871, they built a large business house, which was known as the Blockade Store. In this building, the firm did a large business in drugs and merchandise. In the summer of 1872, the Doctor bought the interest of SARGEANT, and continued the business until 1875, when he was succeeded by his son J. M. #### DR. J. W. WARNER

first settled in this place in '57; moved from here to Clifton, in '60 returned to this place, in '74, and remained here ever since, with the exception of a year he spent in Florida. He opened a drug store . . . and enjoys a good practice.

#### MCKEE & BARD

Jerome BARD came to this place, in . . . in 1861 enlisted and went to . . . in Capt. WILLIAM's company. At the close of the rebellion he returned to this place, and first 'began working for Henry GROSSE, on the . . . side of the track, and in '68, took charge of the grocery department in MILK & POTTER's store, where he remained until '73. F. T. MCKEE settled on a farm near this place with his parents, in '63; clerked for Henry GROSSE for several years, and in '72 he and Frank GROSSE purchased the stock of Henry GROSSE, and engaged in business, which they continued till '73 when Jerome BARD succeeded Frank GROSSE. The firm has continued in business ever since. They carry a well assorted stock of general merchandise, but are now closing out prepatory to moving to Iowa.

#### DR. P. STEBBINS

moved from Wisconsin, in '76, and settled in Clifton, where he remained one year, when he came to this place, and has had an excellent practise ever since. His office and residence is on the east side of the railroad.

#### MRS. F. M. SMITH

established her millinery and notion store in '77. She carries a fine . . . goods, and from a small beginning has succeeded in securing a . . . patronzge. Her store is the . . . door south of the post office, . . . she will be pleased to have her . . . friends and all others wishing . . . in her line to call . . . her stock.

#### THOS. S. SAWYER

#### MEAT MARKETS

John FRITTON came from Ottawa, to this place, in '75, and has been constantly supplying the citizens of this place with the best steaks ever since. John is an excellent butcher.

Mr. OTT moved to this place from Kankakee, but a short time ago, and succeeded Thos. JONES, and is also highly spoken of as a first-class butcher.

#### JAMES M. BURROUGHS

In giving the present officers of the village of Chebanse, we omitted to mention J. M. BURROUGHS, Police Magistrate. Mr. B. was one of the earliest settlers, having been here over twenty-five years. For fifteen years he has been a resident of Chebanse, during which time he has worked and mainly at his trade as carpen-

ter, erecting many of our best residences. He was also in the furniture buziness for several years with Mr. Mark MARTIN.

#### THE RURAL NURSERY

is situated about a quarter of a mile west of town, on the county line, and comprises in its area about forty acres of land, upon which is grown all kinds of small fruits, shrubs, fruit trees, bulbs, in fact every thing to be found in the catalog of a first-class Nursery. It was commenced in 1868, by B. J. WAKEMAN, who is still the proprietor. He sells about \$700 worth of berries, every year, while the sale of shrubs and trees the past year amounted to more than \$1,000. By fair and honorable dealing at all times he has built up an enviable reputation and in consequence enjoys increasing patronage. In 1880 he built a greenhouse and commenced raising bulbs and flowers of all kinds. This fall he built an addition, which enlarged it to 16x75 feet, thus enabling him to engage more extensively in the business.

#### THE CHEBANSE CORNET BAND

is an organization of which our citizens feel justly proud. It was organized in 1869, under the leadership of Fred. KENWORTHY; several years after E. J. WAKEMAN became the leader, and under his management it has continued ever since.

The boys have taken the first prize on three occasions, once at Watseka, when four bands competed for the prize, and twice at Kankakee, and they now enjoy the reputation of being the best band in either Kankakee or Iroquois counties.

(In presenting the history of Chebanse together with sketches of our business men and early settlers to our readers, it may be well to say in justice, to ourselves, that in the present history there has been much of it left out, in consequence of limited time and space, which would doubtless would have rendered it more interesting. We have aimed to give the facts just as they occured, without comment or detail, and as to the success of our efforts we leave the reader to judge.)
