#### **Descendants of Clark Wilber Brownell in Illinois**

#### Generation One

CLARK WILBER<sup>1</sup> BROWNELL was born on 27 Mar 1787 at Dutchess Co., NY. He, 23, married Philophe Corner, 21, on 16 Jun 1810 at probably, Columbia Co or, AlbanyCo, NY. He, 35, married Elizabeth Knapp, 18,, daughter of Henry Knapp and Susanna (--?--), on 10 Jul 1822 at probably, Auburn, Cayuga, NY. He died circa 1863 at Sumner Twp, Kankakee, IL. He was buried at Union Corners Cemetery, Grant Park, Kankakee, IL

Clark was a tailor by trade (all Quakers learned a useful trade) but he was also into land speculation; he bought and sold several properties, both in Dutchess County and then in Onondaga County after 1819, when they moved north. He also lent money for mortgages a few times. In 1819 he was declared 'insolvent'; his investments went bad.

In 1808, at the age of 21, he was 'read out of meeting' by the Quakers for not attending religious services, 'going out of plainness', and attending 'places of diversion'. Clark married Philophe Corner in 1810. They owned property in Dutchess County NY in 1812, adjacent to the Oswego Quaker Meeting House near Verbank where 4 children were born; only William survived. Before 1819 they moved to Onondaga County near Syracuse where Mary was born and Philophe died before 1822.

Clark married Elizabeth Knapp in 1822 and they had 8 daughters, all but the youngest born near Syracuse NY. This was Onondaga County and land records exist for Clark, Philophe & Elizabeth - 1819-C&P, 1823-C&E, 1825-C&E, 1826-C&E, 1829-C&E; Clark alone in 1841.

In 1845 Clark & Elizabeth went to Illinois along with all their daughters and settled near Crete, Will County, IL.

In 1854 the Brownells moved to Sumner Twp about 1.5 miles west of Union Corners (Kankakee County). Mary Brownell Thurber and her family relocated there from upstate New York at about the same time.

Clark Brownell died in Kankakee County in the 1860s but no death record exists for him. There is no will and no probate record. According to Idella's genealogy, he was buried in the Union Corners' Cemetery near Grant Park. Albert Harris says that his grave marker was an inscribed limestone slab which became unreadable and was finally removed. The book 'Kankakee County (IL) Cemeteries, Northeastern Section' on p 255, says only 'Brownell, Park (sic) died about 1865 (Information from a grandson).' The year 1865 is uncertain; Idella said he died in 1863.

She died on 10 Jan 1916 at near, Halls Summit, Coffey, KS, at age 76. She was buried at Prairie View Cemetery.

She was buried at Prairie View Cemetery.

Philopha was born in 1824 near Suracuse NY, oldest of the 8 daughters of Clark & Elizabeth (Knapp) Brownell She was named after her father's first wife (Philophe Corner). In 1843, in NY, at the age of 19, she married James Parmely; they lived most of their adult lives in IL.

#### **Parmely Saga**

In 1844, the newly married James & Philopha (Brownell) Parmely were the first of our family to go west from New York State to Illinois. They settled first in the part of Cook County that is now Chicago Heights. Two children were probably born here, but only William survived.

In 1849 they moved near Momence in what became Kankakee County, then another move in the early 1850s took them to Sumner Twp. At about the same time, Philopha's parents, Clark and Elizabeth Brownell, moved to Sumner Twp. from Crete Twp. in Will County, with their daughters. To make the Brownell family complete, Clark's daughter from his first marriage and her family were also relocating to Sumner Twp. – Mary Leggett (Brownell) & Lyndon Thurber with 3 young children. They were coming from Oneida County, New York.

The big event looming on the horizon then was the Civil War. When it arrived, James Parmalee felt obliged to participate, spite of the fact that he was 40 years old and had 4 children under 10. He joined the 76<sup>th</sup> IL Infantry and served from Aug 1862 until Aug 1865, he did get a pension. According to family tradition, his oldest son William, who was probably only 16 in 1862, also was in the Civil War. I have not found any evidence to support this tradition, but it may be out there somewhere. Perhaps he was supposed to stay at home to help his mother but ran away somewhere instead where he joined the army. Idella Parmely claimed that he was mustered out in TX, where he remained, married, and had a child. She said his death at 28 resulted from his Civil War service.

At some time during the war, maybe in 1863, or maybe in 1865, Clark Brownell died. There is no probate record for him, no will. Perhaps he owned very little to be disposed of. His grave marker was made of inferior stone and soon eroded; the cemetery records say only "Brownell, Park (sic) died about 1865 (information from a grandson)."

Nine months after James Parmely returned from the war, Charles was born. After Charles, there was one more child, Seymour, who died young.

In 1870, wanderlust hit once again, and the Parmelys set out for Coffey County KS. They were soon joined by Philopha's widowed mother, Elizabeth Brownell, and by Philopha's sister Evelyn McKinstry and her family. James & Philopha's son Oliver, who was 18, soon decided to return to IL, but the rest of them lived out their lives in KS.

In 1877, Ella was the first of the children to marry and two years later her sister Ida married. Both of the girls remained iving close to home. Neither of them had any children; they both adopted a little girl to raise.

In 1879, Oliver married back in IL; I doubt that any of his family in Kansas could have traveled all that distance to his vedding. I presume that Oliver's daughter Idella, born in 1880, was named after his sisters Ida and Ella.

Albion was married in 1881 and Elmer early in 1887. Albion lived some distance away, but still within KS; Elmer lived close nearby.

After Philopha's death late in 1887, James lived with the family of his son Charles for 14 years. He died 'of old age' at 78.

- 15. iv. OLIVER CLARK was born on 26 Mar 1852 at Sumner Twp, Kankakee, IL. He, 27, married Martha Jane "Mattie" McKinstry, 19,, daughter of George Provostus McKinstry and Nancy Wheeler, on 24 Dec 1879 at Grant Park, Kankakee, IL. He died on 31 Aug 1923 at Urbana, Champaign, IL, at age 71. He was buried at Union Corners Cemetery.
- **5**. MILLICENT GERTRUDE<sup>2</sup> BROWNELL (*Clark*<sup>1</sup>) was born on 7 Feb 1827 at Manlius, Onondaga, NY. She, 22, married George Wellington Minard M.D., 24,, son of E. B. Minard, on 22 Nov 1849. She died on 25 Jan 1903 at Crete, Will, IL, at age 75. She was buried at Crete Cemetery, Crete, Will, IL.
- Dr. G.W. & Millicent Minard lived in Crete IL all of their adult lives. They had only one child of their own who died as an infant. They adopted her nephew Frank McKinstry.
- 6. URSULA AURELIA<sup>2</sup> BROWNELL (*Clark*<sup>1</sup>) was born on 29 Dec 1830 at Manlius, Onondaga, NY. She, 24, married Ethan Osborn Whitaker, 30,, son of Joel Whitaker and Ruth Newcomb, on 5 Jul 1855 at Amboy, Lee, IL. She died on 13 Sep 1913 at 321 15th Street, Sacramento, Sacramento, CA, at age 82. She was buried at East Lawn Crematory, Sacramento, Sacramento, CA. Ursula was born in 1830 in upstate NY the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 8 daughters of Clark & Elizabeth (Knapp) Brownell. After her family moved to Illinois she married Baptist Minister Ethan Osborn Whitaker in 1855. They lived in Tremont, Tazewell County, IL and had 4 children born there. They moved on to Iowa where he joined the Union forces and died in the Civil War. She had gone back near her family in Crete, Will County, IL where her daughter Frances died at age 4. She returned to Warren County, IA, which is probably where her older son Ethan Wilber died of Yellow Fever. She got a Widow's Pension and did dressmaking, then tried homesteading in Lincoln County, SD in 1875 (it was still a Territory then). Grasshoppers ate the crops so she moved on to Lincoln NE and taught tailoring in the State Industrial School for Unwed Mothers. Her daughter Ruth (Whitaker) Chausee died in 1899 and she moved on to California where her son Fred was living. She lived in Sacramento for the rest of her life and died there in 1913.
- 7. CYNTHIA 'LOUISE'<sup>2</sup> BROWNELL (*Clark*<sup>1</sup>) was born on 16 Mar 1836 at Manlius, Onondaga, NY. She, 32, married Levi Augustus McKinstry, 35,, son of George McKinstry and Miriam St Clair, on 10 May 1868 at Kankakee Co, IL. She died on 31 Aug 1870 at probably, Kankakee, Kankakee, IL, at age 34. She was buried at Union Corners Cemetery.

In 1868 Louise married Levi McKinstry at the age of 32. In 1870 the census reported her, her husband, her mother and her sister Frances all living in one household. Shortly thereafter, Louise gave birth to twin boys. She died after the birth of the twins and the surviving twin, Frank, was adopted by her sister Millicent. Levi died a year later, in 1872.

**8**. SARAH EVELYN<sup>2</sup> BROWNELL (*Clark*<sup>1</sup>) was born on 15 Jun 1839 at Manlius, Onondaga, NY. She, 19, married William Orlando McKinstry, 24,, son of George McKinstry and Miriam St Clair, on 4 Jun 1859 at Kankakee Co, IL. She died on 10 Jan 1916 at near, Halls Summit, Coffey, KS, at age 76. She was buried at Prairie View Cemetery.

Evelyn & William McKinstry lived near McKinstry Corners in Sumner Twp, Kankakee County, IL. About March 1878, they moved to Coffey County, KS. They had 6 children born in IL but only 3 sons grew to adulthood - Arthur, Leslie and William McKinstry. Emma & Levi died young in IL before they went to KS: Merton died in KS at about the age of 7. After the death of her husband in 1909, she returned to the old farm and made her home with her son William until the end.

**9**. FRANCES S.<sup>2</sup> BROWNELL (*Clark*<sup>1</sup>) was born on 1 Jan 1847 at Crete, Will, IL. She, 28, married John King, 34, on 18 Mar 1875 at Grant Park, Kankakee, IL. She died on 14 Nov 1923 at probably, Kankakee, Kankakee, IL, at age 76. She was buried at Union Corners Cemetery.

In 1870 Frances was a teacher. She lived with her mother and her sister and brother-in-law, Louise and Levi McKinstry. Frances & John King had 2 sons, Wilbur King & George Chester King.

Children of Frances S.<sup>2</sup> Brownell and John King both born at probably, Kankakee, Kankakee, IL, were as follows:

She married William Felt, son of David Felt and Mary Holley, in 1888 at Kankakee, IL, After their marriage, they adopted a sister and brother, Hilda and Arthur West, about 5 and 3. The Wests had more children than they could cope with, so they let Hilda and Arthur out to be adopted by Frances and William Felt. She died on 18 Dec 1918 at Spokane, WA, at age 69. She was buried at Union Corners Cemetery.
- **12**. WILLIAM LYNDON<sup>3</sup> THURBER (*Mary*<sup>2</sup> *Brownell*, *Clark*<sup>1</sup>) was born on 24 Sep 1850 at Oneida Co, NY. He, 26, married Elizabeth Emma Snedeker, 19,, daughter of Charles Henry Snedeker and Hannah Eliza Twitchell, on 1 Jan 1877 at Grant Park, Kankakee, IL. He, 60, married Mary Lucinda Calkins on 21 Feb 1911 at Wagoner, OK. He died on 29 Jan 1927 at Momence, Kankakee, IL, at age 76. He was buried at Union Corners Cemetery.

William was born in 1850 somewhere along the Erie Canal where his father ran a canal boat. His parents Lyndon & Mary (Brownell) Thurber had six children born during the years they lived on or near the canal and three of these children died young, possibly due to unhealthy conditions caused by raw sewage floating in the canal. Lyndon did well financially on the Erie Canal though and by 1854, Lynden & Mary had given up on canal life, gone west, and bought a farm of 120 acres in Sumner Twp, Kankakee County, near Grant Park.

William grew up in Kankakee County and was educated in a one-room schoolhouse. When he was 20. the Kankakee Collegiate Institute was founded nearby and he was able to take some courses there. (He appears in the First & Second Annual Catalogues of the Kankakee Collegiate Institute, for the years 1869/70 and 1870/71. His sister Frances is also in the first one.)

In 1877 he married Elizabeth Emma "Libby" Snedeker, who was teaching in a one-room school. He was 26 and she was 19. His father had died in 1875 and he and his brother Frank ran the farm together. This did not work out well, and Frank left the area to work on the railroad shortly after his 1882 divorce.

So, in 1883, William & Libby and their young family were living on an 80 acre farm that was part of his father's original 120 acres. His mother and his two sister's had the other 40 acres. The family lived happily there until Libby died in 1901. By 1906 he had given up the farm and moved into Momence. He is not found in Momence in the 1920 census. His only unmarried child, Clara (15), is living with her married sister Emma (Thurber) Ralston.

William may have been in Oklahoma at this time. He married Mary Calkins in 1911 in Oklahoma where he was probably visiting his daughter Belle and her husband. William and Mary returned to Momence before the 1920 census. William died there of a heart attack in 1927 at age 76. Mary survived him and received most of his property.

In 1870, the family moved to Coffey County,

KS, including 18 year old Oliver. Oliver is in the 1875 census with the family, but soon after went back to Illinois where he took up farming and married Martha Jane McKinstry in 1879. In 1884 he had a general store in Grant Park but in 1892 he sold the store and bought a 160 acre farm in Yellowhead Twp, Kankakee County. (Hist Enc of IL & Hist of Kankakee Co V2).
